LIBRARY DEPARTMENT

(April 2025 - January 2026)

INTRODUCTION:

During the reporting year, the Vivekananda College Library continued to function as the academic hub of the institution, supporting teaching, learning, and research activities. With a strong focus on strengthening collections, expanding digital services, and enhancing user engagement, the library worked consistently towards improving access to quality information resources. This report presents an overview of the library's infrastructure, collections, services, achievements, challenges, and future plans for the academic year.

VISION AND MISSION:**Vision:**

To develop the library as a dynamic learning resource centre supporting academic excellence, research, and lifelong learning.

Mission:

- To provide timely access to quality print and digital resources
- To support curriculum, research, and innovation
- To promote information literacy and ethical use of information
- To adopt emerging technologies for efficient library services

INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES:

The library is housed in a spacious, well-ventilated building with adequate seating capacity for students and faculty. Continuous efforts were made to improve the reading environment and optimize space utilization. Facilities available:

- Reading halls on three floors,
- A separate faculty section,
- Reference and periodicals sections,
- Entertainment fiction and biography sections,
- A career development corner, and
- Digital library terminals for accessing e-resources.

COLLECTION DEVELOPMENT:**1. Print Resources**

The library enriched its print collection in line with curriculum revisions and interdisciplinary needs. During the year, 742 books were added across various disciplines, increasing the total collection to 68,236 volumes. Special emphasis was given to competitive examination materials and reference books.

2. Periodicals

The library subscribes to 13 newspapers and 23 national and international magazines in English and Hindi. E-newspapers in multiple languages are also accessible through digital platforms. These resources support academic needs, general awareness, leisure reading, and competitive exam preparation.

3. Digital Resources

The library provides online access to resources through its regularly updated in-house website. E-resources subscribed by DULS are made accessible to faculty and students. QR codes are widely used to enable quick access to OPAC, e-resources, and digital services.

Key initiatives include digitization of previous years' question papers under the Institutional Repository, online display of scanned cover pages and indexes of newly acquired books in PDF format and dissemination of library updates through social media platforms. Plagiarism-checking support is provided to faculty members. An online feedback survey showed 91.5% user satisfaction, with 89% rating services as very good.

AUTOMATION AND ICT INITIATIVES:

The library is fully automated using an Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) and is RFID-enabled. Automation has streamlined cataloguing, circulation, OPAC access, and report generation. RFID and barcode-based systems ensure efficient circulation and enhanced book security, supported by regular data backup and system maintenance.

USER SERVICES:

The library provides user-focused services such as circulation, reference support, CAS, and SDI. Regular guidance and daily training sessions on e-resources, OPAC, DU e-library, plagiarism awareness, and search strategies have strengthened students' digital literacy and research skills.

INFORMATION LITERACY AND USER EDUCATION:

To strengthen information literacy, the library organized orientation programmes for newly admitted students, hands-on training on OPAC and e-resources, and workshops on research methodology, citation styles, and reference management tools.

SUPPORT TO TEACHING, LEARNING, AND RESEARCH:

The library actively supported academic and research activities by assisting faculty in book selection, lecture preparation, and research publication. Researchers received support in literature search, referencing, and plagiarism checking, while students were guided in project work, assignments, and competitive exam preparation.

SPECIAL INITIATIVES AND BEST PRACTICES:

The library organized displays of new arrivals and thematic book exhibitions and celebrated important days such as Hindi Diwas, Constitution Day, Partition Day, and the completion of 150 years of Vande Mataram.

National Library Week was celebrated, during which four regular users were awarded appreciation certificates and presented with Anandmath. The library also promoted the use of Open Educational Resources (OERs).

ORGANIZATION OF LIBRARY RESOURCES:

Significant efforts were made to improve organization and accessibility of resources. Textbooks were placed on front racks in their respective sections, reducing search time and improving circulation efficiency. Hindi-medium entertainment fiction was organized separately. Clear labeling, proper shelving, and systematic classification enhanced user satisfaction and space utilization. Old and damaged books were weeded out following standard procedures.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS:

Major achievements during the year include a cleanliness drive under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan with active NSS participation, increased usage of e-resources, improved user satisfaction, successful organization of training programmes, strengthened ICT infrastructure, and active contribution to NAAC/IQAC activities. The Governing Body Chairperson visited the library and appreciated its functioning.

LIBRARY STAFF AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Library staff demonstrated dedication and professionalism, actively participating in FDPs and training programmes on library automation, cyber forensics, leadership building, well-being, and digitization. Library assistants attended a week-long training programme at the Central Library, enhancing operational efficiency. Staff also contributed actively to academic and administrative activities of the institution.

CHALLENGES FACED:

The library faced challenges such as budgetary constraints for high-cost resources, increasing demand for digital content, and managing growing user expectations with limited manpower.

FUTURE PLANS:

Plans for the coming year include expanding e-resource subscriptions, introducing advanced digital and remote access services, strengthening the institutional repository, and organizing more research-oriented information literacy programmes.

Students reported that the visit deepened their appreciation for

democracy, human rights, and social justice, making Dr. Ambedkar's legacy more relatable and meaningful.

- **Intra-College Regional Oral Narration Competition on Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas (15 November 2025):** The Ambedkar and Social Justice Committee, in collaboration with the Northeast Cell of Vivekananda College, organized an intra-college regional oral narration competition to commemorate Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas, celebrating the birth anniversary of Birsa Munda (Dharti Abba). - **Internship Activities:** During the academic year 2025, the Placement Cell coordinated multiple internship opportunities for students. Under the guidance of Teacher Coordinators Dr. Shivani Kalra, Ms. Megha Rawat and Dr. Vishakha Jain, students participated in internship drives conducted by various organisations.
- **JOLT Internship Programme:** A total of 64 students applied for the JOLT internship programme, out of which 16 students were selected. The internship was conducted in work-from-home mode for a duration of eight weeks during August 2025. In August 2025, 16 students from B.Com, B.Com (Hons.), and BA (Hons.) English programmes undertook an 8-week Work From Home internship under the JOLT program. ACTIVITIES:

During the academic year 2025–2026, the College Canteen Committee played an active role in ensuring the availability of hygienic, nutritious, and affordable food for students, teaching faculty, and non-teaching staff. The Committee regularly monitored the functioning of the college canteen and worked towards maintaining high standards of quality, hygiene, and user satisfaction.

- **Regular Inspections and Hygiene Monitoring:** The Committee conducted periodic inspections of the college canteen to assess food quality, cleanliness, storage practices, and compliance with hygiene standards. Emphasis was placed on the cleanliness of utensils, cooking areas, dining spaces, availability of clean drinking water, and proper waste disposal.

- **Menu Review, Pricing, and Health Measures:** The menu was reviewed periodically to ensure a balanced variety of food items at reasonable prices. Special attention was given to food safety measures, particularly during peak seasons. Instructions were issued to canteen staff regarding personal hygiene and safe food handling practices.
- **Infrastructure Survey and Improvement Measures:** On 8 August 2025, the Canteen Committee conducted a survey to assess infrastructural requirements for the smooth functioning of the college canteen. The survey identified the need for upgrading old furniture, improving ventilation through ceiling and wall-mounted fans, enhancing lighting facilities, providing additional dustbins, and renovating damaged tiles in the canteen, back area, and kitchen backyard. Based on the findings of the survey, the Committee submitted a proposal outlining the necessary requirements for renovation and improvement. The proposal was approved by the Respected Principal and the Purchase Committee.
- **Lunch and Refreshment Arrangements for DUSU Election Day:** The Canteen Committee successfully organized lunch and refreshment arrangements on 18 September 2025, the day of the DUSU Election. These arrangements ensured convenience and comfort for students, teaching faculty, non-teaching staff, and election officials present on campus. The smooth execution of the arrangements was made possible through effective coordination among committee members.
- **Survey for Establishment of Teachers' Corner:** During the academic year 2025–2026, the Committee undertook an initiative to assess the feasibility of establishing a dedicated Teachers' Corner in the college canteen. The survey was conducted on 28 August 2025 and 1 September 2025 under the leadership of the Convenor, Dr. Shahnaz Begum, with active participation from committee members. The upper floor of the college canteen was identified as a suitable location and evaluated in terms of space, accessibility, and comfort, in the presence of members of the Canteen Committee, Purchase Committee, and non-teaching staff. Based on collective observations and positive feedback, the proposal was found to be feasible and beneficial. The Committee recommended appropriate furnishing, air-conditioning, and ergonomic arrangements for the Teachers' Corner to promote faculty comfort, informal academic interaction, and a collaborative institutional environment.
- **Refreshment Management during Annual Fest "Pallavi":** On the occasion of the Annual Fest "Pallavi," held on 9th and 10th February 2026, the Canteen Committee played an important and responsible role in managing the refreshment arrangements. ACTIVITIES:

- **Orientation'25 Stall (20 August 2025, Outside Sharda Hall):** A dedicated stall was set up by the Health and Wellness Committee during the Orientation Day to introduce freshers to the committee and its core values. The teacher convenor and student coordinators, along with members, actively interacted with students and explained the committee's role in promoting mental, emotional, and physical well-being on campus. Freshers were encouraged to participate and contribute towards building a healthy and inclusive college environment. ACTIVITIES:
