DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

LIBRARY DEPARTMENT

Library is pleased to present its Annual Report for the financial year 2024-2025. The report highlights the major initiatives, events and achievements of the library in the past year. The library continues its endeavor to serve as a center of academic and cultural engagement, taking the knowledge of students and faculty to new dimensions. Following are the primary objectives: -

- To enhance the library’s collection of resources.
- To improve access to digital and physical resources.
- To promote a reading and research culture among students and faculty.
- To upgrade library infrastructure and adopt modern technology.

In keeping with the same spirit, this year's highlights are:

Library Collection Acquisition: The library added a significant number of resources to its collection:

- **Books:** The collection now totals 68236 after 565 new books from various disciplines were added.
- **Magazines and Newspapers:** 13 Newspapers and 23 magazines are subscribed by the library for general knowledge, leisure reading and competitive examination.
- e-Databases, e-journals, and e-Books are accessible through (DULS), University of Delhi. It brings millions of resources to the patrons’ access on a click of mouse as well as on their smartphones.
- e-Newspaper and e-magazines are also accessible through DULS

Library usage (Circulation)

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- The library recorded approximately 23248 transactions in the patron recording software. Additionally, 10656 circulation transactions, including inter-library loans through DELNET, were processed using the Library Management Software (LSease) and RFID software (KSmart).
- Approx 720 first year students were registered for the library membership for this year.

Digital Services at a Glance

- The library is accessible online through its in-house created and maintained website. It can be accessed through any internet browser using its Website URL
- The collection and services of the library are accessible through QR codes. The library's website, bulletin boards, and standees positioned on reading room tables provide convenient access to these QR codes.
- As part of the Institutional repository, old question papers are routinely digitized and uploaded on the library's website. These are accessible through QR code.
- Cover pages and indexes of the acquired books are regularly scanned to create soft copy and updated as PDFs on the library's website and OPAC.
- Information is shared on all library social media channels, including Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, YouTube, and WhatsApp. QR codes of all of the tools are displayed at various locations in the library.
- The library assisted in plagiarism checking for faculty research papers.
- An online feedback survey of final-year students showed that about 86.7% of users are satisfied with the library. 84.8% of surveyed users feel library services are very good. The library staff will continue working to further improve user satisfaction.

Key Events and Initiatives

1. Academic and Student-Centric Activities
 - The library organized an Exhibition of weeded out books, where students were given the opportunity to find books of their interest and take them for free.
 - Orientation sessions were conducted using the interactive board and powerpoint presentation to introduce new students to the library's resources and services.
 - The library continued its Book Bank Scheme, allowing students to borrow books for the entire semester, ensuring academic support to them.
2. Celebrations, Commemorations & Exhibitions
 - The library celebrated Independence Day with a book exhibition, honoring freedom fighters, Hindi Divas by showcasing the works of Hindi poets and writers, Gandhi Jayanti showcased Mahatma Gandhi's life and contributions and for National Library Week, a suggestion sheet was introduced to gather ideas for new titles and authors.
 - Posters were displayed to celebrate various events, including Jayanti of Guru Govind Singh, Swami Vivekananda Jayanti, Republic Day Celebration, Basant Panchami & Lohri, Ravidas Jayanti, and Chatrapati Shivaji Jayanti. Students participated in these events, showcasing their enthusiasm and library involvement
3. Professional and Administrative Updates
 - Delegates from the University of Buraimi visited the library. The library was honored to host international delegates from University of Buraimi, fostering cross-cultural academic exchange.
 - Certificates of plagiarism were issued to four of the faculty members applying for promotion to professor cadre.

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- Stock Verification: Staff diligently conducted complete stock verification of library books as per GFR Rule no. 194. The report is being compiled.
 - Weed out process to eliminate obsolete and unserviceable library books from the library collection. 2710 books have been weeded out of the collection. The same were exhibited to the library patrons to take away free of cost.
 - Staff: - Against vacant posts of the library, outsourced staff has been recruited. It has helped in enhancing the efficiency of library operations, shelving and cleaning. Professional Assistant 'Veena Sharma' retired after a long service. Library acknowledges her invaluable contributions.
4. Professional Development:
- Librarian Dr. Rajni Jindal attended an Online NEP Orientation & Sensitization Programme organized by CPDHE (University of Delhi), Delivered Invited lectures for SCERT seminars for school librarians.
 - Library Assistants Mr. Sudhir Gidh and Mr. C.P. Singh attended a one-week offline training program for library cadre, enhancing their professional skills.

छात्रवृत्ति शुल्क रियायत एवं छात्रा सहायता कोष समिति ने 27/8/2024 को साक्षात्कार के आधार पर द्वितीय एवं तृतीय वर्ष की छात्राओं के साथ-साथ परास्नातक द्वितीय वर्ष की छात्राओं को Student Aid Fund के लिए चयनित किया। कुल 62 प्रार्थना पत्र प्राप्त हुए, जिसमें से नौ छात्राओं को 100% (13500 रु) एवं 48 छात्राओं को 50% (7500 रु) प्रदान किए गए।

तत्पश्चात 25.3.2025 को प्रथम वर्ष (स्नातक) एवं परास्नातक (प्रथम वर्ष) के लिए आवेदनों के आधार पर साक्षात्कार लिया गया। कमेटी ने सर्वसम्मति से 17 में से 15 छात्राओं को चयन किया, जिसमें से चार छात्राओं को 100% (13820 रु.) और जबकि 11 को 50% (6,910 रु.) अनुदान प्रदान किया गया, जबकि 2 छात्राओं को अनुपस्थिति के कारण चयनित नहीं किया जा सका। इसी दिन अर्थात् 25/3/2025 को प्रथम, द्वितीय एवं तृतीय वर्ष की 39 छात्राओं को Fee concession 2024-25 के 180 रु. प्रत्येक छात्रा एवं तीन परास्नातक छात्राओं को 216 रु. प्रदान किए गए। साक्षात्कार के समय संयोजिका डॉ. योजना कालिया के साथ कमेटी के सभी सदस्य डॉ. तुलसी, डॉ. अंकिता, डॉ. सुरेश, और डॉ. केशव उपस्थित रहे।

The Vivekananda Garden is a serene and sustainable space on our college campus. Enhanced with air-purifying plants and oxygen-rich zones, it significantly improves air quality while offering a refreshing environment. Green waste is efficiently managed through compost pits, reflecting eco-friendly practices. This remarkable achievement is due to the tireless efforts of the Garden Committee and the dedicated malis (gardeners), who work relentlessly to nurture the greenery and preserve the garden's beauty. Their collective commitment has transformed the Vivekananda Garden into a model of sustainability and an inspiring space for relaxation, learning, and community engagement. Below are the highlights of the key activities carried out by the committee over the past year:

- The Vivekananda College Garden has been awarded the prestigious Award of Achievement for Sustainable Garden recognising its exceptional eco-friendly design and practices by Indraprastha Horticulture Society on 8th February 2025
- On 20th July 2024 in collaboration with Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation (SSSSO), Delhi NCR, the committee organised a successful Plantation Drive across the campus. A total of 108 trees were planted, significantly enhancing the greenery of the college grounds. As part of this initiative, ECO Club members adopted the plants, and each tree was given a unique name. Regular plant inspection drives were carried out by the members to ensure that the saplings thrived and received proper care. This initiative not only contributed to environmental sustainability but also encouraged students to actively participate in the preservation and maintenance of the campus greenery.
- The Garden Committee and ECO Club also organized the “Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam” campaign, where trees were planted to honor mothers, with the aim of symbolizing care, growth, and love. Saplings of different tree species were distributed to students and staff members, encouraging them to present these saplings to their loved ones, particularly their mothers, as a symbol of love and affection. The campaign also aimed to create awareness about the importance of green spaces and environmental conservation.
- The Plant Inspection Week initiative is a proactive effort to protect the greenery of our college garden and support the gardeners in its upkeep. During this week, students actively participate by selecting specific days to inspect the health and well-being of the plants.

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They monitor signs of drying or distress and submit detailed reports to the Garden Committee. These reports help identify plants that need immediate attention, enabling timely care and ensuring their sustainability. This collaborative initiative not only strengthens the garden's maintenance but also fosters environmental responsibility among students, making them active contributors to preserving the garden's beauty and health.

- A visit was organised on 6th February 2024 for the members of Indraprastha Horticulture Society who held the Flower Show Competition annually. The visit which took place between 10 AM to 11 AM, allowed the guests to witness our college campus.
- ECO Club was invited to the flower festival where various horticultural displays enchanted the minds and students could gain insights into flower cultivation. Additionally, the college's efforts in gardening and landscaping were recognized at the Flower Festival Event held at Bahubali Park, Karkardooma, where Vivekananda College was awarded the Best Garden Award for its well-maintained and beautiful green spaces.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS COMMITTEE

The Health and Wellness Committee of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi is committed to promoting physical, mental, and emotional well-being among students and staff. The committee aims to instill a holistic approach to health by organizing various health awareness programs, check-up camps, and outreach activities throughout the academic year. With a strong emphasis on preventive care and lifestyle awareness, the committee encourages a healthy and balanced college environment.

- The Committee organised a Painting Competition on 27th August 2024 on the theme "Good Food, Good Health - Let's Fight Anemia". Students expressed their ideas about healthy eating and anemia prevention through vibrant artworks.
- A Homoeopathy Check-up Camp was organised on 11th September 2024 in collaboration with certified homoeopathic practitioners. The camp offered free consultation and basic health checkups to students, faculty, and staff. The event witnessed total 62 active participations and raised awareness about alternative healing practices.
- An Ayurvedic Health Check-up Camp was conducted on 18th September 2024 to introduce students and staff to traditional Ayurvedic diagnostic methods and remedies. Practitioners provided free health assessments and lifestyle advice based on Ayurvedic principles. Total 40 students showed for the checkup.
- The Committee initiated weekly health check-up camps (alternating between Homoeopathy and Ayurveda). These camps became a regular feature, providing ongoing healthcare access and encouraging students and staff to prioritize their health and well-being. Total 50 students showed up for regular check-ups.
- In collaboration with Unnati Health Management, the Committee organized a 30-minute interactive talk on Health and Wellness on 24th October 2024. The session focused on lifestyle management, stress reduction, and the importance of mental and physical well-being.
- An Anemia Awareness Drive was conducted on 19th November 2024 with the help of dedicated student coordinators and volunteers. Awareness sessions were held in every class, canteen and staff room where students shared valuable information on the symptoms, causes, and preventive measures of anemia.

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- The Committee in association with DSPRUD, organized an insightful seminar on 15th January 2025 to raise awareness about the risks and impact of over-the-counter (OTC) antimicrobials and antimicrobial resistance (AMR). Engaging Activities included:
 - Quiz Competition: Tested participants' knowledge on antibiotics and AMR.
 - Debate: Students discussed the pros and cons of OTC antimicrobials.
 - Social Media Campaign Challenge: Students created awareness posts, infographics, and videos to spread the message digitally.
- For the past two to three years, the medical room lacked a nurse, which is why it was not fully functional. However, the Committee helped in the appointment of a nurse, and soon the medical room will be fully operational with all necessary facilities.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

The Internal Complaints Committee in association with Shahadra District Legal Services Authority, Delhi organised a legal awareness programme on Prohibition, Prevention and Redressal of Sexual Harassment against Women at Workplace on 9 September 2024, Monday at 10: 00 AM in the Sharada Hall. The lecture was part of the ICC's initiative to sensitise and create awareness amongst Teaching Faculty, Non-Teaching Staff Members and Students about provisions and mechanisms of POSH (Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Workplace) Act. The speaker for the session was Ms. Neelam Narang, who is a practising Public Prosecutor with over twenty-nine years of experience. Ms. Narang has been a member of the Delhi Commission for Women and a legal advisor to the Delhi Police on matters related to crime against women. Ms. Narang spoke about the POSH Act 2013, enumerating its implementation at institutional level, punishments for non-compliance and legal provisions, the role and duties of the ICC at the college level and the procedure to be adopted during a non-partial enquiry. Ms. Narang told the audience about the latest case of sexual harassment presented before the Honourable Supreme Court in 2022, Aureliano Fernandez vs The State of Goa to highlight the necessity of implementing the POSH Act 2013 at the workplace. The session raised many pertinent issues and encouraged the audience to raise questions about the role of college as a work environment and the role of bystanders in aiding the aggrieved women during a distressful situation. The session was coordinated by Ms. Vandana Soni. The session was attended by Teaching members and Non-Teaching employees along with 103 students. The student coordinators for the event were Ms. Priyanshi and Ms. Khushi. The Teacher Coordinator for the event was Arunabha Bose. The Convenor for the session was Anju Nagpal.

The ICC received a complaint of sexual harassment on 8 November 2024. The ICC convened five meetings and obtained written testimonies from witnesses. The ICC involved an external member, Dr. Anita Kant (Previously Associate Professor of Applied Psychology) in the investigation. In its final meeting on 2-12-2024, the ICC consensually decided to close the case and submit a final report to the college.

IQAC

Internal Quality Assurance Cell

IQAC and the Department of Applied Psychology, Vivekananda College, in collaboration with the National Institute of Social Defence (NISD) under the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, successfully organized a two-day National Conference on Aging in the Digital Era: Navigating Social Change and Beyond on September 30 – October 1, 2024. The conference convenor, Prof. Vanita Sondhi and Co-Convenor, Dr. Sujit Ram Tripathi along with the team members, worked collaboratively to organize a meaningful and insightful event, fostering discussions on the challenges and opportunities faced by senior citizens in the digital era while commemorating the International Day of Older Persons. The event brought together over 400 participants, including academicians, researchers, policymakers, and students, with 75 research papers presented across ten themes. Eminent speakers, including Prof. Nandita Babu, Prof. Girishwar, Prof. Arvind Kumar Mishra (JNU), and international experts from Oman's University of Buraimi including Dr. Shad Ahmad Khan, Dr. Boumedyen Shannaq, and Dr. Devarajanayaka, shared valuable insights.

IQAC and E-cell, Vivekananda College, in collaboration with the University of Buraimi, Oman, and Delhi Metropolitan Education (DME), GGSIPU, organized a two-day International Conference on Global Perspectives: Fostering Entrepreneurship, Inclusion, and Innovation for Sustainable Futures on February 12-13, 2025. The event organized under the convenorship of Dr. Shafaq Zareen, saw participation from 500 students and experts across disciplines. Day 1, held at Vivekananda College, featured esteemed guests, including Chief Guest Prof. Zafar Sareshwala and notable speakers from academia, business, and research. Over 35 national and international presenters contributed through technical sessions addressing entrepreneurship, gender, socio-economic inclusion, and regional disparities. Day 2, hosted at DME, Noida, included a valedictory session with Hon'ble Justice Bhanwar Singh and distinguished speakers from industry and academia. Panel discussions explored sustainable entrepreneurship, innovation, and global business trends. The conference fostered mentorship and interdisciplinary dialogue, promoting a culture of entrepreneurship and inclusion.

E-cell and IQAC in collaboration with the University of Buraimi, Oman, and Ideal Institute of Management and Technology, Delhi, organized E-SUMMIT 2025 on February 14, 2025. The summit aimed to foster entrepreneurship, innovation, and networking among students and professionals. The event featured keynote addresses by Chief Guest Dr. Amarendra Pani and Guests of Honour Dr. Manish Madan and Dr. Shad Ahmad Khan. Panel discussions, a workshop by Prof. S.K. Palhan, and student competitions like Saahas 2.0 and AD-MAD Show engaged participants. 26 teams participated in these two competitions collectively including the teams from Oman. Dr. Seema Nath Jain (E – Summit Convenor, Vivekananda College) elaborated on the theme of E-Summit. The summit provided valuable insights into entrepreneurship and business growth.

MENTORING COMMITTEE

- The Mentoring Committee aims to guide students throughout their academic, career, and personal development during the academic year 2024-2025. The Committee's core mission is to foster students' academic growth while supporting their emotional and social well-being. By offering resources, feedback, and interpersonal support, the committee has been instrumental in building students' confidence, morale, and independence, preparing them to face future challenges successfully.

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- The Committee's key objectives this year included providing comprehensive academic and career guidance. To ensure the effectiveness of mentor-mentee interactions, the committee implemented a structured action plan. After the admission process, mentor-mentee groups were formed based on the teacher-student ratio. Mentors held counseling sessions, addressing both academic and personal concerns during their assigned time slots. Furthermore, mentors kept track of attendance and documented the issues raised by students and the guidance provided, ensuring continuous monitoring and support.
- The mentoring initiative aimed to prepare students for their future careers and encourage positive contributions to the college and society at large. Through their guidance and support, students have been equipped with the tools they need to succeed academically and professionally. The Committee remains committed to fostering students' growth and looks forward to continued success in the coming year.

NEP COMMITTEE

The NEP Committee for Research was formed by the Staff Council of the College (2020-2025). The members include: Prof (Dr.) Sukhneet Suri (Convenor), Dr. Meena Pandey, Dr. Ratish C. Jha, Dr. Arushi Jain, Dr. C. Lal Muanpuia and Dr. Maanas Sharma.

The committee was actively involved in the following:

- Organized a five day NEP Orientation and Sensitization programme under the aegis of Malviya Mission Teacher Training Programme (MMTP) in collaboration with the Faculty Development Center, Hansraj College (University of Delhi), from 3-13 August 2024.
- Organized a Financial Literacy Workshop for students in collaboration with the National Stock Exchange by a SEBI-certified trainer on 3.9.2024. 89 student participants actively took part in this workshop.
- Developed IEC material on NEP framework and posted on college campus for enhancing awareness of students and faculty regarding the four year NEP_UGCF framework.
- The committee is in the process of compiling folk songs on agriculture of the north-east to sensitize/ popularize students and masses at large regarding the rich culture of the north eastern region.

NO SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND NO SMOKING CELL

Breaking Free: A Step Towards a Drug-Free Future

With the guidance of Prof. (Dr.) Salma Seth (Nodal Officer) and with the dedicated efforts of student coordinators Maitrei Bhardwaj and Lavanya Shukla, the No Drug Abuse, No Smoking Cell has been actively working to create awareness and foster a drug-free environment.

Recognizing the urgency of this issue, the No Drug Abuse, No Smoking Cell has undertaken several initiatives:

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- A significant step in this direction was the poster-making competition held in April on the theme “Don't let drugs steal your dreams.” This competition encouraged students to express their thoughts on the dangers of addiction through creative visuals, emphasizing the importance of making informed choices.
- Furthering this mission, the cell organized an event under the theme “The Mantra for a Developed India: A Drug-Free India.” The event began with an insightful speaker session, where students were informed about the psychological and physiological effects of substance abuse. The discussion also addressed strategies to resist peer pressure and the broader implications of addiction on an individual's future. The session was followed by a compelling Nukkad Natak (street play), which depicted how easily substance use can become a habit and the challenges individuals face when trying to break free from addiction. The performance effectively conveyed the emotional and social consequences of substance abuse, resonating deeply with the audience.
- To reinforce these messages, signages have been put up across the college campus, depicting the ill effects of substance abuse and the power of positive affirmations. These visual reminders serve as a daily motivation for students to make conscious decisions that prioritize their health and well-being.

NORTH EAST CELL

The Northeast Cell of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi, aims to promote the interests and ensure the welfare of the students from the states of Northeast India. The cell strives to integrate the Northeast students with the college community and also sensitize the community about the cultures of Northeast India. In the academic year 2024-25, the Northeast Cell had organized and participated in four events. The details are as follows.

- The Northeast Cell organized a poster campaign on Organ Donation as part of Indian Independence Week celebration on 14th August 2024. The campaign aimed to sensitise the students community about the importance of organ donation and how organ donation can battle organ trafficking in the medical industry.
- The students of Northeast Cell were invited to participate in an exhibition and conference organized by the PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, at the Constitution Club of India, New Delhi. It was a three-day exhibition/conference from 12-14 September 2024. A total of fourteen students performed a fusion of various folk dances from Northeast on the 14th of September.
- The Cell organized an orientation program to welcome the new batch of first-year students from the Northeast to the college on 4th October 2024. A total of 30 students and 3 teachers participated in the program. The orientation provided an overview of the curriculum, activities, and facilities of the college. The session also included an interaction session between the new students and senior students to foster a sense of belonging and community among the students.
- The cell organized a special lecture on Northeast Literature on 13th November 2024. Dr. K. B. Veio Pou, Associate Professor, Department of English, University of Delhi, was the guest speaker for the event. A total of 60 students and 10 teachers attended the lecture. The lecture was the first of the lecture series planned by the cell to foster the spirit of research among the students. Pou spoke on the history of Northeast Literature, its position in Indian English Literature, and the emerging trends and challenges in Northeast Literature.

NSS ASSISTANCE

- A session was organized to create awareness about women's health, with the theme of gynecological issues. Celebrity gynecologists were invited to provide information on preventive care, disease detection at an early stage, and keeping reproductive health fit.
- NSS unit celebrated Kargil Diwas to commemorate the valour of Indian troops who laid down their lives during the Kargil War. Flag-hoisting ceremony was followed by speeches and discussions regarding national unity and patriotism.
- To mark the 75th anniversary of India's independence, a series of events, such as seminars and discussions, were conducted to bring into focus the importance of the Quit India Movement. The event motivated the students to learn about the fight for freedom and its applicability in the present times.
- In the aim of generating awareness about the need for organ donation, the event promoted organ donation pledges among students and teachers to save lives. Various myth-busting sessions were conducted in order to spread awareness.
- To encourage a secure and supporting campus in school institutions, the NSS unit vigorously participated in the Anti-Ragging campaign. Sensitization seminars and workshops were organized to impart knowledge about the ill-effects of ragging and legal liabilities.
- The NSS unit conducted a stationery drive to gather basic items such as notebooks, pens, and school supplies for poor children. The drive was conducted to assist the education of poor children belonging to marginalized communities.
- In coordination with Nutrition Week, the NSS unit conducted a food donation drive. Students donated and distributed healthy meals to orphanages, old-age homes, and homeless shelters in the local area.
- A visit was organized to an old age home, where the students interacted with the elderly, chatted with them, and did small acts of kindness. The objective of this campaign was to instill intergenerational solidarity.
- Under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, as part of an initiative, NSS unit conducted a two-week sanitation drive under Swachhta Pakhwada scheme. Students participated in cleanliness drives within the college campus and in the surrounding areas, reiterating the idea of cleanliness.
- NSS Day was commemorated with special emphasis on sanitation. Students and staff members undertook a cleanliness drive across the campus, with an emphasis on waste disposal, segregation of recyclables, and creating awareness on waste disposal.
- With a view to giving back to the environment, the NSS unit conducted a tree plantation drive on NSS Day. Saplings were planted by the students on the college campus with a view to environmental conservation and green drives.
- During NSS Day, a Blood Donation Camp was organized in association with the Red Cross Society. The camp witnessed active participation by students and staff members, who donated blood to save lives.
- A Nukkad Natak (street play) was conducted to create awareness on social problems such as the conservation of the environment, gender equality, and communal harmony. Students demonstrated their acting talent while conveying strong messages to the audience.
- In an effort to make the student community aware of breast cancer, an awareness camp was conducted by the NSS unit with health experts. The students were made aware of early detection, prevention strategies, and the need for routine check-ups.

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- Under the Breast Cancer Awareness program, a hair donation camp was organized in which students and staff members donated their hair voluntarily to be converted into wigs for cancer patients who are going through chemotherapy.
- A special Nukkad Natak was organized in the slum areas to create awareness on hygiene, education, and women's rights. The show was well appreciated by the residents, who were impressed by the initiative to involve them in social causes.
- For fundraising for different social causes, the NSS unit conducted a fundraising camp on campus. The amount collected was utilized for imparting education, healthcare, and basic needs to underprivileged communities.
- In association with health professionals, the NSS unit organized a series of yoga sessions to maintain physical and mental health.
- A cancer prevention and awareness talk was held with experts talking about early detection, prevention, and screening. The session demystified the disease and urged students to take preventive measures.
- A CPR training session was held to impart life-saving skills to the students. The participants were taught basic first-aid methods and the correct techniques of administering CPR in case of emergencies.
- As a mark of giving at the time of Diwali, the NSS unit conducted a Diwali Donation Drive collecting clothes, groceries, and essentials to be given to poor families.
- NSS unit organized a human chain for awareness about environmental and social issues. Students stood hand in hand to give a powerful message on the need for community and people's power.
- A workshop on self-defense was conducted for empowering women by giving them information and skills about how to safeguard themselves. Techniques for physical defense and methods for coping with uncomfortable situations were provided in the workshop.
- On National Unity Day, the NSS unit screened documentaries depicting the life and achievements of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, followed by speeches and discussions on national unity.
- The NSS unit initiated a traffic safety campaign to increase awareness on road safety regulations and the need to comply with traffic regulations. Students distributed pamphlets and conducted discussions with local citizens.
- As a part of their movement to encourage education, the NSS unit created educational murals and wall paintings all over the campus and in local communities. They painted messages pertaining to education, health, and social harmony on these murals.
- In a bid to foster inclusivity, the NSS unit conducted a "Run for Inclusion" event, which invited students to run together with differently-abled people. The event brought to the fore the need for inclusivity in every walk of life.
- The NSS unit was actively involved in Vigilance Awareness Week, sensitizing students to the need for transparency, accountability, and ethical behavior in governance and public life.
- Children's Day was observed with the Students' Benevolent Fund (SBF), where students arranged entertaining activities, games, and a special program for poor children, filling their lives with joy.
- On Constitution Day, the NSS unit organized a Padyatra (foot march) to create awareness regarding the Indian Constitution. Participants shouted slogans regarding unity and national pride while disseminating knowledge of constitutional values.
- A lovely painting session of wall art was conducted by the NSS unit, wherein students painted colorful murals symbolizing national heritage, freedom, and cultural diversity.

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- The NSS unit celebrated Vijay Diwas with fervor, commemorating the victory of the Indian Armed Forces in the 1971 Indo-Pak war. There was a ceremony conducted with patriotic fervor, recalling the martyrs' sacrifice.
- The NSS unit celebrated Veer Bal Diwas, a day to commemorate the martyrdom of Guru Gobind Singh's sons. The day comprised discussion and cultural performances that echoed the principles of bravery and selflessness.
- The Seva Sandwich project entailed preparing and giving away sandwiches to homeless and poor people. The act of charity united the college community in a gesture of service.

PLACEMENT AND CAREER GUIDANCE AND INTERNSHIP

Placement Internship and Counselling Committee serves as a bridge between academia and industry, fostering professional development among students. The cell has three objectives; provides guidance- career counselling, and support for placements, internships, The committee is functioning under the convenorship of Dr. Vishakha Jain with total 6 members (Dr. Radhika, Ms. Sakshi, Ms. Shivani Kalra, Ms. Megha Rawat, Ms. Himanshi and Mr. Pulkit.

Placement Drives: This session witnessed the participation of companies from multiple sectors and industries extending placement opportunities to the students. Some of the prominent recruiters of our college are DE Shaw & Co., Accenture, The Oberoi Hotels and Resorts.

Recruiting companies with broad profiles successfully selected students for various positions such as business development associate, public relation, cloud tech support associate, human resource, event management, finance, marketing. The details are as follows:

- Accenture: Accenture selected three students for Cloud Tech Support Associate roles, each receiving an annual CTC of ₹3,44,100.
- The Oberoi Hotels & Resorts conducted a drive on October 22, 2024, where two students were chosen, one for an OCER Associate role with a CTC of approximately ₹3 lakhs, and another whose selection process is ongoing.
- Planet Spark: recruited two students as Business Development Counsellors with a lucrative annual package of ₹6,50,400 each.
- Other participating companies, such as Astrotalk and Magicpin, saw significant applications but no selections this year.

Internship Drive: Internships were offered from different companies Max - View Now, Rural Handmade, and Mobility Foresights. However, the highlight was CCI India, which selected seven students for roles in event management and research, each offering a stipend of ₹5,000 per month. These positions aimed to provide hands-on experience in various domains like public relations, human resources, and event management.

Career Counselling session:

- Career in Aviation Industry - On September 18, 2024, ARISE hosted a session on career prospects in the aviation sector, facilitated by professionals from IGIA. Students were introduced to opportunities in fields like cabin crew, airport management, and tourism. With 96 attendees, the session received positive feedback for its interactive and informative approach.

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- Building a Powerful LinkedIn Profile - On September 11, 2024, Ms. Shivani Kalra, Assistant Professor, conducted a session on leveraging LinkedIn for career growth. Students learned to create compelling profiles, connect with HR professionals, and explore job opportunities. The session saw active participation from 92 students and was highly appreciated.
- UPSC Guidance- - On January 31, 2025, Mr. Prashant Sharma from Drishti IAS led a session on UPSC preparation strategies. The session emphasized time management, skill development, and consistency, providing practical tips and motivational anecdotes. With over 100 attendees, this session was an overwhelming success.

Workshops & Activities organized by Skill Enhancement Committee:

The Skill Enhancement Committee of Vivekananda College successfully organized a series of interactive and insightful workshops, competitions, and educational visits aimed at enhancing students' professional and personal skills.

All the following Activities & Workshops were conducted by the Committee Convenor Dr. Shahnaz Begum.

- On the occasion of the week-long Independence Day celebrations in 2024, the Skill Enhancement Committee of Vivekananda College organized a Poster Making and Slogan Writing Competition on 14th August 2024. The theme of the event was "Organ Donation: Educate and Advocate." A total of 22 students participated in poster making and creatively depicted the importance of organ donation, broke myths, and encouraged people to pledge for this noble cause. Courses Offered:

- The Committee organized a Digital Poster Making Competition on 25th March 2025. The theme of the competition was “Cultural Diversity - One World Many Colours” which provided students with an opportunity to express their thoughts and ideas through digital art. A total of 27 participants took part in this competition, showcasing their artistic and technical skills.

- In case of clashes in class, preference will be given to the Department whose slot is reflected in the master timetable.
- Every faculty in the Department should have the information related to the syllabus and evaluation of the paper in the provided timetable.
- All faculty members should take at least 16 lectures per week.
- All faculty timetables should have at least 2 free slots for the mentoring classes.
