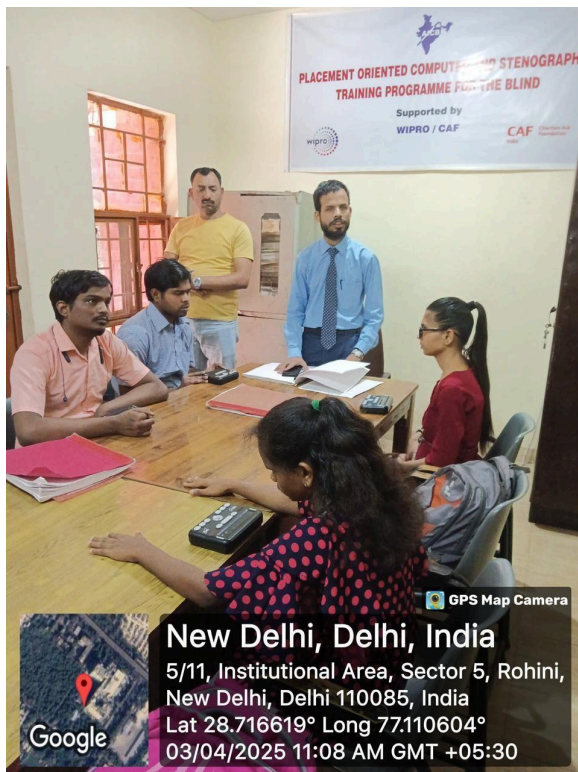

“Promoting Human Rights and Dignity of Visually Impaired Senior Citizens”

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Vivekananda College organized a talk on “*Human Rights and Dignity of Visually Impaired Senior Citizens: Role of Family, Society and Street*” on 13 October 2025 in Sharda Hall. The session, attended by around 60 faculty members and students, aimed to promote awareness, inclusivity, and equity.

The resource person, Mrs. Manjula Rath, Senior Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, shared insightful perspectives drawn from her personal experiences as a person with visual impairment. She emphasized the importance of inclusive language, gender equality, sensitisation, and the supportive role of family and society in empowering persons with disabilities. The talk also highlighted societal attitudes, cultural narratives, and the role of technology in enhancing independence among visually impaired senior citizens.

The session concluded with a vote of thanks by the student coordinators and was appreciated for fostering empathy, awareness, and a commitment to inclusivity among participants.
