
Overall Sample Size:





3.1 Clarity of course objectives 123 Responses







3.3 Curriculum balances theoretical and practical knowledge




3.4 Extent to which the course generates interest in subject areas





3.5 Depth of course content 123 Responses






3.7 Method of assessment of students' performance





4. Action taken report on feedback: 2022-2023

- 1. The clarity of course objectives requires further enhancement. While students are briefed on these objectives, it is essential for teachers to invest more time in effectively communicating this information. This will be achieved through orientations, mentormentee sessions, classrooms, and tutorials.
- 2. Courses must cultivate heightened interest in the field. This entails embracing innovative pedagogies like experiential learning and Problem-Based Learning, which present real-world challenges for students to tackle, coupled with a commitment to ongoing technology integration. The college will persist in its investment in technology.
- 3. Deepening the course content is imperative. Teachers will be incentivized to conduct thorough reviews of existing materials, pinpointing areas for expansion and the inclusion of advanced concepts. Feedback loops will be established with the university. Training sessions for teachers, along with seminars to broaden their knowledge, will promote teaching pedagogies that incorporate real-world case studies, cutting-edge research, and industry insights. Continuous updates to the library are ensured.
- 4. Enhancing the relevance of course content to real-life applications is crucial. Teachers will be motivated to align instructional material with practical examples, case studies, and industry-specific scenarios. Field visits will be increased, and a push for more internships will be emphasized.
- 5. The adequacy of suggested references requires improvement. Gathering feedback on preferred reference types from students is pivotal. Consulting field experts will contribute to refining the reference list. Seminars and conferences, where experts not only discuss new research but also provide valuable information about resources will conducted.
