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SSF VNC CAMP

The Social Outreach and Community Development Committee (SOCDC), Vivekananda College, has continued to engage itself with social outreach and extension activities. One programme has partnered with Slum Swaraj Foundation (SSF) – an NGO and is focused on conducting regular educational camps for the slum children in Jhilmil Colony. Education is the first step in the making of an advancing society. Primary education is an out-and-out prerequisite for continuous development. Primary schools make an influence on children's academic progress as well as their family background. The main objective of Slum Swaraj Foundation is to bring awareness among the children, open avenues of opportunities along with self-development and reduce inter-generational academic poverty.

In the last session, during the pandemic, the offline camp was not functional and due to this college student members were engaged in the online 'Saarthi: Ek Ache Kal Ke Liye initiative' to support students from nearby slum areas. The Saarthi initiative aims to establish a relationship between a teacher (Student member) and a student (underprivileged) on the basis of Intellectual Guardianship. With the concept of "Each One Teach One",

But from 1st September 2022, an offline camp has been started for the kids of Jhilmil Colony. A day in a week is assigned to each volunteer for going to camp and teach Jhilmil kids. Besides teaching, they celebrate festivals and national days with them. Volunteers also help them with moral support, educational guidance, etc. The initiative is running successfully. 37 volunteers are part of this initiative.

Donation Drive

A donation drive was organized by Social outreach & Community Development Committee under the project HUM, in association with Slum Swaraj Foundation from the 23rd August, 2022 to the 31st August, 2022. A poster and message were circulated throughout the college. Two boxes were placed at both the gates of the College so that students could donate stationery (pens, pencils, eraser, sharpener, unused copies, crayons, pencil colors, paints, geometry box), books (NCERT books from class 1-12, handwriting copies, story books, drawing copies, poem-prose books) and other things like plastic mats and toys during the college hours (9 am-5 pm). The response to the donation drive was generous. Students donated new boxes of sharpeners, erasers, pencils, and paints. There were NCERT books for classes 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th. These donation items have helped the children extract a smoother, better learning that we work to provide them with. 37 volunteers were involved in this.


The Placement and Career Counselling Cell of Vivekananda College as part of the year long DU Centenary Celebration organised an online workshop "Resume Writing: Structuring Professional Profiles" on 25 September 2022, Sunday at 10:00 AM through Google Meet

<u>https://meet.google.com/kmk-tpem-jkj</u>. The session was conducted by **Mr. Arunabha Bose**, Assistant Professor of English, Vivekananda College.


Mr. Bose introduced young Undergraduate students to types of Resumes, namely the Chronological, Functional and Hybrid Resume. He emphasised that *Functional* resumes present candidate skill sets and discussions independent from job descriptions, if those descriptions are included at all. In this resume type, skill listings come before all other content. He went onto enumerate that in a functional resume, candidate's qualifications, experience, and achievements are grouped into "skill areas," rather than tied to specific positions and dates. Students can moreover group qualifications depending on their career direction, but possible headings include: Communication skills. Leadership skills. Customer service experience. Organizational skills. Technical experience. Sales experience. Management experience. Financial skills. Teaching/training skills. Then Mr. Bose spoke about important guidelines for streamlining, formatting, and editing the Resume with emphasis in typeface, Fonts, Margins and orientation. Mr. Bose emphasised the need to use Action verbs in order to lend dynamism and impact to the Resume. With illustrative examples of a recent Commerce graduate, Applied Psychology graduate and Bachelors of Arts graduate, Mr. Bose exhibited the structuring of Resumes with Career Orientation/Goal, Career Profile/Self-Branding and Work Experience. Mr. Bose stressed the need to formulate a qualitative skill based Resume in opposition to a quantitative chronological Resume with an emphasis on converting Employment Details into personal strengths and core skills such as customer service, time management, team work and problem solving. He displayed specific examples to suggest how General Undergraduates with no experience, Commerce and Accountancy Undergraduates with No experience and Humanities Undergraduates with No Experience might organise their skill sets into decipherable and concrete objectives. He displayed slides with Skill summaries of an Accountancy and Business Administration Graduates, an Administrative Assistant Aspirant, a Community Outreach Volunteer, a Computer Programming Student and an Applied Psychology Undergraduate with minimal experience. He further underlined the need to segregated the Resume into different skill based categories such as Management Skill, Aptitude and Analytical Skill and Leadership Skill. He emphasised the need to bridge and demarcate skills acquired during Internship and Temporary employment from Volunteer work and Community services. He advised students to pay attention on marketing their employable and additional skills such as Community Outreach, Membership of Industrial Associations, Academic Achievements and Distinctions and University related Activities. Mr. Bose finally concluded his presentation with illustrative examples of Cover Letters (Solicited and Unsolicited) clearly outlining the need to demarcate the letter into three coherent and legible sections: In the First Section the candidate states the job title (and number when given), where the student saw the posting, and her/his desire to interview for the position. Later, he/she supports requests for consideration by offering an accurate assessment of his/her qualifications. In the middle section the candidate thoroughly shares with readers what he/she has learned through inventorying his/her qualifications and achievements and analyzing his/her goal-

focused competencies and capabilities. This can be done simply by rephrasing the resume's qualification summary. The candidate is required to retrospectively look back, then look forward, and, most importantly, share his/her confident, future-focused views. The Cover Letter must address questions like: Why the candidate has chosen the field? What does the candidate's background have to do with the field and the function he/she wishes to serve? What are the key qualities required to serve within the desired day-to-day roles? Some of the illustrative examples he shared were Cover Letters written by an Accountancy Student, a B. Ed student, a Commerce student and a Bachelor of Arts student ranging from letters documenting professional competence to letters chronicling personal learning and growth. The session ended with an interactive session with students posing their respective queries to Mr. Bose

The session ended with Dr. Gopika Bhandari, Associate Professor, Department of History, Vivekananda College and Ms. Anshi Saxena offering the invited speaker a vote of thanks. Mr. Arunabha Bose encouraged students to draft Resumes focussing on the Qualitative Approach highlighted by him and share their output with him for a personalised tutoring session. The session was co-hosted by Ms. Vaishnavi Singh. The Workshop was conceptualised and organised by Dr. Veena Jain, Convenor of Placement and Career Counselling Cell and Associate Professor of Commerce. The workshop was attended by 71 attendees.

The Placement and Career counselling cell of Vivekananda College organized a webinar on 11thOctober 2022, Tuesday at 12:00 PM in the Sharada Hall. The topic for the workshop was "Learning Skills Of Personal Branding And Cracking Placements". The workshop was conducted by Dr. Abdul Qadir , an experienced professor at JAIPURIA Institute of Management. The event was coordinated by Ms. Preeti Sharma. The workshop was designed to equip students about placement opportunities available after graduation.

Dr. Abdul Qadir is an academician, trainer, and consultant, having experience of 20 yrs. in the domain of HR & OB. His interests lie in the domain of Strategic HRM, HRIS, Comp. & Ben., HR Analytics and Psychometrics. To his MDP/Training endeavors, he has conducted numerous sessions on topics like; Conflict Management, Personality Mapping, Team Work Competency, Interpersonal Relations, Personal Effectiveness, Leadership Skills & Team Building and Time Management for organizations like; NTPC, IFFCO, NDDB, KRIBHCO, Tata Chemicals, NFL, Coromandel, TCIL and Bhutan Officials..

The speaker emphasized on personal branding, their facts and the areas associated with personal branding. He also focused on checklist of personal branding that include knowing ourselves and SWOT analysis; knowing the procedure; how to take charge of it; how to evaluate ourselves and some procedure to improve networking to improve personality development. The event became informative wherein the students grasp useful information and guidance required for the preparation for the placements and improvement in decision making power. He also focused on cracking some common questions that are asked during interview and strategies for managing group discussion.

The event saw a positive and encouraging response from students of all disciplines and was attended by 123 students. The session concluded with a vote of thank to the teacher Convener Dr. Veena Jain, and the Teacher Coordinators Ms. Gopika, Ms. Vishakha, Mr. Arunabha Bose and Mr. Yamunam Rocky for managing the entire event.





Topic: How to Prepare For Aptitude Test




The Placement and Career counselling cell of Vivekananda College organised a workshop on 12 October 2022, Wednesday at 12:00 PM in the Sharada Hall. The topic for the workshop was "**How to Prepare for Aptitude Test**". The workshop was conducted by Mr. Praveen Chandra, an experienced faculty member at TIME (Triumphant Institute of Management Studies). The event was coordinated by Mr. Shekhar. The workshop was designed to equip students about prospective career prospects available to them after graduation.

Mr. Chandra emphasised that every competitive/recruitment process requires the indispensable skill of Aptitude. Government examinations such as UPSC and SSC, Bank PO examinations as well as entrance examinations for admission to MBA require a basic Aptitude Test. An Aptitude Test generally focuses on Three distinct areas: 1. Verbal Ability Reasoning and Comprehension (English), Quantitative Aptitude (Elementary Maths) and Logical Reasoning and Data Interpretation. The workshop primarily focused on Quantitative Aptitude, knowledge of the subject and skills such as Time Management, Decision Making Skills, Cognitive Analysis, Predictability Skills, and a Positive Mindset. Mr. Chandra emphasised that all questions have equal weightage and therefore the process of selection and elimination is crucial and the decision-making skill of the individual is of vital importance. The individual must be able to manage time under pressure. Aptitude is a combination of knowledge and skills and therefore requires practice along with revision, observation, adaptability, and quick thinking. For Quantitative Aptitude, elementary mathematical knowledge acquired till Class X is deemed sufficient. Adaptability is key to negotiating the difficulty level of the subject especially in examinations such as CAT. Mr Chandra discussed some aspects of Quantitative Aptitude by engaging the audience in a select series of MCQs based on Profit-Loss strategies, Simple Interest-Compound Interest, Simple Quadratic Equation, Cost Price-Selling Price Indexation etc. Mr. Chandra emphasised the fact that smart thinking can enable individuals to change their answering strategies by developing innovative solutions based on ready references and techniques which scan the available choices to arrive at the answers efficiently and accurately.

The event saw a positive and encouraging response from students of all disciplines and was attended by 112 students. The session concluded with a vote of thanks. Dr. Veena Jain, Associate Professor and Convenor of The Placement and Career Counselling Cell was the Teacher Coordinator for the event.









Topic: Mass Communication and Media Studies: Eligibility and Prospects

The Placement and Career Counselling Cell of Vivekananda College organised a seminar on "Mass Communication and Media Studies: Eligibility and Prospects" as part of the DU Centenary Celebrations on 20th October 2022, Thursday at 12:00 PM in the small auditorium in the physical mode. The seminar was addressed by **Dr. Anugyan Nag**, Assistant Professor at Mass Communication Research Centre, Jamia Millia Islamia University. Dr. Nag is a distinguished filmmaker, Film Scholar with years of teaching experience and a Fulbright Fellow. Dr. Nag spoke about the concept and myths about "Media Education". He underlined the need to distinguish between the academic prospects of pursuing media education and the career prospects of media studies. He classified the concept of media studies under the distinguished criteria of – Practice and Academics. As far as academic prospects of Media Studies is concerned, Dr. Nag underlined that UGC guidelines specify that a student from any disciplinary background can enter into the discipline. However, he underlined that a

background in Humanities and Social Sciences is elementary for entering into traditional fields like journalism or digital and emerging platforms. He emphasised that a command over language and diverse linguistic proficiency is necessary for entering into media studies. However, venturing into Editorial vocations requires skill-based understanding and not just Humanities Background. The NET eligibility test packages all expressions of media studies such as Print, Mass Media, PR, Social Media or Digital Media into one subject - Mass Communication and Journalism. Dr. Nag went onto emphasize the prospects of pursuing a Master or PGDM degree in Journalism/Mass Communication from IIMC, Jamia Millia Islamia's MCRC (a leading media studies centre offering 5 Masters and 3 PGDM courses), Mudra Institute of Communication, Ahmedabad (offering courses in strategic communication for Planning/Marketing/Publicity/Launch Campaigns and offers courses such as MBA in Communication Management where some of the papers taught are Media and Cultural Studies. Strategic Planning and Communication Theory), National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad (offering specialisation in Visual Communication and a diverse range of career prospects ranging from Art Director/Production Designer to Textile Designer/Animator and Advertisement Professional), FTII, Pune and Satyajit Ray Film and Television Institute, Kolkata which offer specialisation in Screenwriting, Editing, Sound Recording, Cinematography and Directing as part of it's various four-year courses. Developmental Communication which emphasizes Women's Health, Sanitation and Children's Health is in high demand and graduates are recruited by prestigious organisations such as WHO, UNESCO, UN and OXFAM. Digital Media related Courses are also being offered in Private Universities such as Ashoka, Shiv Nadar and Aziz Premji University. Dr. Nag informed us that MCRC, Jamia Millia Islamia makes around 25 films every year for the Information and Broadcasting Ministry of Government of India and undertakes research related works such as Community Radio broadcast. As far as Career Prospects in Print Media are concerned, Dr. Nag emphasised that a young trainee is likely to recruited as a copyeditor or trainee journalist; however, students do not get recruited in Print and Television Media easily because of lack of linguistic proficiency.

Dr. Nag underscored in the next part of the lecture, the importance of preparing oneself for a career in the media. A rigorous understanding and proficiency in language — both verbal and written is indispensable for a career in Media Studies. He emphasized the need to develop skills such as editorial techniques to select/trim/clip a footage into the desired length for a story. He further encouraged students to develop an interest in regional politics and not just national politics to be familiar with regional nuances and specificities. He underlined the fact that English Journalism is still a global market leader because many countries such as China, Russia, France, Japan and Brazil have their own nationalised Global English Channels. He

informed students about certain subsets of journalism such as Science Journalism especially with the emergence of Digital Platforms, Political Journalism focussing on International Affairs/International Relations (Border Conflict/Neighbourhood Conflict/Conflict and Peace Negotiation) and Climate/Environmental Journalism. Apart from the changed idea of TV which is now being live streamed through digital forums outside the country of origin, the idea of Radio has also changed with the emergence of Podcasts which is the fastest growing digital platform apart from OTT which has democratised film exhibition. Dr. Nag ended his lecture by talking about the Teaching Industry emphasizing the need to develop a profile by publishing papers in different platforms and forums. Dr. Nag underlined the fact that the modern era is the era of content creators and influencers and a full time career can be made by developing a diverse variety of content. Content writing provides practitioners with flexibility and independence but requires the authentication of information and thus ethical information gathering is of vital importance.

The session ended with a robust question-answer round where students posed a wide array of questions to Dr. Nag ranging from patterns of question papers in Entrance Examinations to prospects of applying to Foreign Universities. The session ended with a vote of thanks delivered by Mr. Arunabha Bose. The Teacher Coordinator for the event was Dr. Veena Jain, Convenor of Placement and Career Counselling Cell. Ms. Vaishnavi Singh and Ms. Garima Talwar were the student coordinators for the event. The session was attended by students of B.A. (H) English, B. Com (P) and B.A. (P). The session was attended by 105 students

Cost of course is Rs. 55,000 which was proposed to make student friendly by discounting it and by making student pay 30% at the beginning and the rest at the time of their working as an employee. The session concluded by clearing all the doubts of participants and a vote of thanks to Mr. Tarun and Max Healthcare for enriching the students with knowledge and offering such a valuable job guaranteed course.



Seminar On Strengthening Your Resume Through Certificate Courses

Session on Resume Building

The Placement and Career Counselling Cell of Vivekananda College as part of the year long DU Centenary Celebration organised an online workshop "Resume Writing: Structuring Professional Profiles" on 8 February 2023, Wednesday at 10:00 AM in Sharada Hall. The session was conducted by Mr. Arunabha Bose, Assistant Professor of English, Vivekananda College.

Mr. Bose introduced young Undergraduate students to types of Resumes, namely the Chronological, Functional and Hybrid Resume. He emphasised that Functional resumes present candidate skill sets and discussions independent from job descriptions, if those descriptions are included at all. In this resume type, skill listings come before all other content. He went onto enumerate that in a functional resume, candidate's qualifications, experience, and achievements are grouped into "skill areas," rather than tied to specific positions and dates. Students can moreover group qualifications depending on their career direction, but possible headings include: Communication skills. Leadership skills. Customer service experience. Organizational skills. Technical experience. Sales experience. Management experience. Financial skills. Teaching/training skills. Then Mr. Bose spoke about important guidelines for streamlining, formatting, and editing the Resume with emphasis in typeface, Fonts, Margins and orientation. Mr. Bose emphasised the need to use Action verbs in order to lend dynamism and impact to the Resume. With illustrative examples of a recent Commerce graduate, Applied Psychology graduate and Bachelors of Arts graduate, Mr. Bose exhibited the structuring of Resumes with Career Orientation/Goal, Career Profile/Self-Branding and Work Experience. Mr. Bose stressed the need to formulate a qualitative skill based Resume in opposition to a quantitative chronological Resume with an emphasis on converting Employment Details into personal strengths and core skills such as customer service, time management, team work and problem solving. He displayed specific examples to suggest how General Undergraduates with no experience, Commerce and Accountancy Undergraduates with No experience and Humanities Undergraduates with No Experience might organise their skill sets into decipherable and concrete objectives. He displayed slides with Skill summaries of an Accountancy and Business Administration Graduates, an Administrative Assistant Aspirant, a Community Outreach Volunteer, a Computer Programming Student and an Applied Psychology Undergraduate with minimal experience. He further underlined the need to segregated the Resume into different skill based categories such as Management Skill, Aptitude and Analytical Skill and Leadership Skill. He emphasised the need to bridge and demarcate skills acquired during Internship and Temporary employment from Volunteer work and Community services. He advised students to pay attention on marketing their employable and additional skills such as Community Outreach, Membership of Industrial Associations, Academic Achievements and Distinctions and University related Activities. Mr. Bose finally concluded his presentation with illustrative examples of Cover Letters (Solicited and Unsolicited) clearly outlining the need to demarcate the letter into three coherent and legible sections: In the First Section the candidate states the job title (and number when given), where

the student saw the posting, and her/his desire to interview for the position. Later, he/she supports requests for consideration by offering an accurate assessment of his/her qualifications. In the middle section the candidate thoroughly shares with readers what he/she has learned through inventorying his/her qualifications and achievements and analyzing his/her goal-focused competencies and capabilities. This can be done simply by rephrasing the resume's qualification summary. The candidate is required to retrospectively look back, then look forward, and, most importantly, share his/her confident, future-focused views. The Cover Letter must address questions like: Why the candidate has chosen the field? What does the candidate's background have to do with the field and the function he/she wishes to serve? What are the key qualities required to serve within the desired day-to-day roles? Some of the illustrative examples he shared were Cover Letters written by an Accountancy Student, a B. Ed student, a Commerce student and a Bachelor of Arts student ranging from letters documenting professional competence to letters chronicling personal learning and growth. The session ended with an interactive session with students posing their respective queries to Mr. Bose

The session ended with Dr. Gopika Bhandari, Associate Professor, Department of History, Vivekananda College and Ms. Anshi Saxena offering the invited speaker a vote of thanks. Mr. Arunabha Bose encouraged students to draft Resumes focussing on the Qualitative Approach highlighted by him and share their output with him for a personalised tutoring session. The session was co-hosted by Ms. Vaishnavi Singh. The Workshop was conceptualised and organised by Dr. Veena Jain, Convenor of Placement and Career Counselling Cell and Associate Professor of Commerce. The workshop was attended by 109 attendees.





The Women Development Cell of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi, organized an inter-college competition, 'Who Run the World 2.0' on 14 October 2022.







- More strict rules on ragging/bullying
- Making mental health facilities grading system in campuses mandatory by NAAC
- Maintaining a sound counselor-client ratio in educational institutions and organizations.
- 'Psych camps' should be set up in urban and rural areas- just like medical camps, which provide free medical evaluations and help; professionals from the field can donate some time for pro-bono work in these camps.

• Promoting psychological first aid courses amongst the youth and further making them part of the educational curriculum.

• Creating localized helplines (numbers and centers) for suicide prevention and mental health care, to increase accessibility and availability; were shared.

National Vigilance Day - Step Ahead As Anti Corruption

Vigilance meaning state of being watch and alert. A person in a position of authority who engages in dishonest or unethical behaviour, either to further their own or another person's interests, is said to be corrupt. It is a universal phenomenon that touches all social classes in

some capacity. Economic development, democracy, the environment, public health, and many other things are all threatened by corruption. Therefore, it is crucial that the people be educated about and inspired by initiatives to root out corruption. Today we commemorate National Vigilance Week to stop corruption.

A democracy is a form of government "by the people, for the people," which gets legitimacy through openness and a system of checks and balances. Democracies are characterised by vigilance and awareness. But in reality, Corruption is a common problem in democracies.

Theme for National Vigilance week

Every year, the week of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's birthday (October 31) is designated as Vigilance Awareness Week. According to a decision made by the Commission, Vigilance Awareness Week in 2022 will be marked from October 31 through November 6. According to the Central Vigilance Commission's instructions, CIL headquarters will observe Vigilance Awareness Week-2022 from October 31 to November 6, 2022. This year's Vigilance Awareness Week will focus on "Corruption free India for a developed Nation," which is the topic for the week. The first national vigilance commissioner was Nittoor Sreenivasa Rau.

Vigilance Awareness Week from October 26th to November 1st, 2021, with a lot of enthusiasm and involvement. A number of events were planned to promote awareness in regards to corruption.

'Independent India at 75: Self Reliance with Integrity' was the theme.

2020 year's Vigilance Awareness Week, had the theme "Satark Bharat, Samriddh Bharat (Vigilant India, Prosperous India)," taken placed from October 27 to November 2, 2020. Human greed, or an excessive urge to succeed and it was linked to corruption in daily life.

Background

On October 31, 2000, the Central Vigilance Commission established the custom of honouring the week beginning with Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's birthday as Vigilance Awareness Week. The goal of Vigilance Awareness Week is to raise public awareness of the negative impacts of corruption.

When the then-Chief Vigilance Commissioner wrote a piece in 2000, the concept of "Vigilance Awareness Week" was first proposed. According to a report on CNBC TV18, the letter stated that corruption was "anti-national," "anti-economic progress," and "anti-poor."

CVC - Central Vigilance Commission

The CVC is designed to be the top vigilance institution, independent of all executive powers. It is responsible for overseeing all vigilance activity conducted on behalf of the Central Government and providing guidance to various authorities within Central Government organisations on how to plan, carry out, evaluate, and reform their vigilant work

The Central Vigilance Commission has been transformed into a multi-member Commission having "statutory status" as of August 25th, 1998, following the President's promulgation of an Ordinance.

How to celebrate?

- Create human chains wherever possible in the affected cities, towns, and villages. Organize visible events like street plays, public gatherings, and marathons, triathlons, and other such activities.
- By Display of signs, banners, and posters, as well as handout distribution, at visible locations, including those in offices, field units, and public areas eg. branches of Banks, Petrol Pumps, Railway Stations, Airports etc.
- Establish camps for citizens and customers to file complaints with businesses that offer customer-focused products or services. Similar to that, wherever necessary, vendor meetings may be scheduled.
- For the purpose of raising awareness, social media sites, bulk SMS/E-mail, WhatsApp, electronic and print media, etc., may be used extensively.
- creating a consciousness among high school and college students about the negative repercussions of corruption. All organisations are encouraged to support the creation of "Integrity Clubs" in schools and colleges because young people are the nation's future assets and it is crucial to instil moral principles in them.
- Develop a Gram Sabha awareness campaign forspreading knowledge about corruption's negative impacts among citizens in Gram Panchayats (in rural and semi-urban areas).

Purpose

The Commission thinks that corruption is a significant barrier to the country's advancement. To maintain integrity in all facets of our national life, all societal segments must remain watchful. As part of this year's Vigilance Awareness Week, the Commission wants all organisations to concentrate on internal (housekeeping) tasks that will be undertaken in a campaign style. This entails streamlining internal procedures, assigning tasks in a timely manner, and making systemic improvements while leveraging technology. The Commission emphasises the importance of ensuring transparency in all processes, including payments to contractors, home allocations, asset updates and digitization, including property records,

condemnation of old furnishings, and removing outdated records while adhering to established procedures and regulations.

The identification and implementation of systemic changes inside organisations has been advised. They could then post them in the public domain on the website of their organisation. To ensure more distribution of the systemic reforms and good governance initiatives, this might be sent to the CVC.

The foundation training course for probationary bank officers and several other cadres, such as scientists, includes a section on preventive vigilance. A module on preventive vigilance is also included in the Mid-Career Training Program for middle level officers of the organised Group A services under several Ministries of the Government of India. Visits to Excellence Institutes, village visits, and other activities have been added to modulate the conduct of public servants with regard to honesty and openness, as well as to affect attitude change.

Unity and integrity day

Sardar Patel, who played a significant part in India's political unity, was born on this day, and it is honoured as his birth day. The National Unity Day "will provide an opportunity to reaffirm the inherent strength and resilience of our nation to endure the real and potential challenges to the unity, integrity, and security of our country," according to the official statement from the Home Ministry of India.

For his ability to lead the nation through the war for independence and beyond, most notably during the federation of the princely states and the India-Pakistan War of 1947, Vallabhbhai Patel was given the title "Sardar" (chief).

Significant

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, a seasoned freedom warrior and the nation's first home minister, is remembered in India on October 31 as National Unity Day for his significant role in persuading many princely states to join the Union of India after Independence. The day is observed as a tribute to the "national unity," for which the nation is eternally thankful to Patel for his significant efforts that led to India's unification. In 2014, the government stated that October 31 would be observed as National Unity Day or Rashtriya Ekta Diwas in honour of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.

Background

Sardar patel commemorated on October 31 in India. The Indian government first made it available in 2014. India observes National Unity Day on October 31. The Indian government first made it available in 2014. The holiday is observed to commemorate the birthday of Sardar Vallabhai Patel, who was crucial to India's political unification.

The Home Ministry of India said in its official statement for National Unity Day that the occasion "will provide a chance to re-affirm the inherent strength and resilience of our nation to endure the real and potential challenges to the unity, integrity, and security of our country.

On this day, a commitment is read aloud in government buildings: I solemnly pledge that I dedicate myself to upholding the nation's unity, integrity, and security, and I also make a strong effort to propagate this message among my fellow citizens. I make this commitment in the spirit of my nation's unification, which was made possible by the vision. and Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel's deeds. I also firmly swear to do my part to support my nation's internal security.

On the banks of the Narmada river in Vadodara, Gujarat, stands tall The Statue of Togetherness in honour of him as a massive representation of India's unity. In 2018, the statue was unveiled. The 146th anniversary of Vallabhbhai Patel's birth will be commemorated this year.

Theme

Rashtriya Ekta Diwas was established in 2014 in honour of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, who served as India's first deputy prime minister after independence.

Patel was a key figure in the independence movement in India and the unification of the country's 560 princely republics.

As the centrepiece of National Bullying Prevention Month, PACER's National Bullying Prevention Center established Unity Day. called for taken was to "Make it end and colour orange. Join Forces Against Bullying" Participants were urged to don orange to support the fight against bullying.

Celebration

Additionally, in honour of the Iron Man of India, the Indian government erected a sizable statue of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel close to the Narmada River in Gujarat.

"The day will provide an opportunity to re-affirm the inherent strength and resilience of our nation to endure the actual and potential challenges to the unity, integrity, and security of our country," the Home Ministry of India stated in an official statement on National Unity Day.

In 2014, the Indian government declared the day in honour of his birthday to be National Unity Day. relating to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel Narendra Modi, the Prime Minister of India, unveiled a massive Statue of Unity in Gujarat, close to the renowned Narmada River, for his country's 143rd birthday.

National Integration Camp 2023

The regional Directorate of NSS, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India in collaboration with Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agriculture University, Hisar, Haryana organized a National Integration Camp at CCSHAU, Hisar, Haryana from 26.02.2023 to 04.03.2023. NSS Regional Directorate, Delhi coordinated with the host University and managed the camp of NSS volunteers of 13 states in around 200 numbers including 10 volunteers from Delhi (4 from Delhi University and 6 from GGSIPU). NSS volunteers Sikkim, Jammu and Kashmir, Andhra Pradesh, West Bengal, Odisha, Punjab, Assam, Maharashtra, Telangana, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Delhi, Haryana under the guidance of respective Program Officers participated in the said camp. The details about every day proceedings of the camp are given below:







DAY 1-Registration and Inauguration (26/02/2023)

In the morning of 26/02/2023, registration of the volunteers and Program Officers was done on arrival basis. Next, a Hawan was performed to seek blessings of God before beginning of the camp. Further, the inauguration was done by lighting a lamp in the presence of following dignitaries –

- Prof. B.R. Kamboj, Vice-Chancellor at CCSHAU
- Shri Jangjilong, NSS Regional Director, Delhi
- Dr. Dinesh Kumar, Directorate of Higher Education, Haryana and State NSS officer
- Dr. Atul Dhingra, Director Students Welfare
- Dr. S.K. Pahuja, Dean of College of agriculture CCSHAU
- Bhagat Singh, NSS Coordinator at CCSHAU

After the inauguration, volunteers along with the dignitaries sang NSS song together. Then, the dignitaries enlightened the volunteers about importance of NSS and how it bonds the people of India irrespective of their caste, creed, religion or gender. Furthermore, Dr. Atul Dhingra asked the volunteers to interact with each other and learn new things from them. Then, there was a lunch break. After lunch, all the volunteers were divided into 10 teams irrespective of the states they belonged to. In the evening, poem recitation and poster making competitions were organised in which two members from each team participated. Day 1 of the camp ended with the cultural performance of Haryana.

DAY 2 (27/02/2023)

The 2nd day of the camp started with a yoga session that began at 06:30 AM and ended at 08:00 AM. The yogic practices were done under the guidance of a reputed Yoga Trainer, Shri. Rohtash Arya. After the breakfast the first academic session started at 09:00 AM in which Mr. Sajjan Kumar (Sub-Inspector IGO office), gave a lecture on nation building and volunteerism. He gave the speech on the problems faced by youth like drugs, suicide, road accidents. Additionally, he encouraged to volunteers to stay vigilant and help the needy. Next, he

interacted with the volunteers and addressed their questions. The second academic session included a guest lecture by Rajinder Saini (Former Deputy Secretary Punjab State Red Cross). He gave lecture on CPR and first-aid. He taught the volunteers how to save the life of a person in emergency through CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation). He also spread awareness about the first-aid to be given to brain haemorrhage patients. After academic session, the events of the 2nd day of the camp started. There was solo singing and College making competition and 2 participants from each team participated in these competitions. Games and recreational activities were also conducted in the evening. In the end, volunteers of the states of Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir and Delhi performed cultural dances and songs to represent their culture.







DAY 3 (28/02/2023)

Third day at camp also started with morning yoga. After breakfast, the day started with lamp lighting and NNS anthem. The schedule of the day was based on G20 & Y20 activities. The chief guest was the Dr. Surinder Singh (CCS AVC, Hisar). He delivered the academic lecture on the environment problems and solutions, climate change and global warming. The second academic lecture was given by Devender Singh Dahiya who was a 4-time NSS awardee. He conducted a motivational talk and made volunteers aware about the role of formal education in personality development. After lunch, there was speech competition after the as usual 2 participants from each team participated in the competition. Next, an integration march was also conducted in which all the states represented their culture. Further, the volunteers from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh gave their cultural performances. The third day of the camp ended with national anthem.







DAY 4 (01/03/2023)

Our day started with morning yoga. After breakfast, the academic session started with lamp lighting and NSS song. The academic session included a lecture by Mr.Naveen Jain (Comptroller, CCS HAU, Hisar) on entrepreneurship. He encouraged the volunteers to not only invest in finances but also in their relations, health and family. After lunch, there was a historical visit to Agroha Dham. Agroha Dham is a Hindu temple complex in Hisar district, Haryana, India. Construction of the temple started in 1976 and was completed in 1984. The temple is dedicated to the Hindu goddess Mahalakshmi. In the evening, volunteers from the states of Maharashtra and Rajasthan gave cultural performances. As usual, the day ended with national anthem.









DAY 5 (02/03/2023)

Day 5th of the camp started with a morning session. After breakfast, the proceedings started with NSS song. The academic session of the day included a lecture by Niraj Kumar Gupta

(State Media Coordinator, State Council Member of Govt. programs and an industrialist by profession). The topic of the session was "Art of living". He made the volunteers aware about various techniques to focus on present. According to him, controlling breathing can give people liberty to control their emotions. It was a very interactive session. After that, he also introduced the volunteers into the practice of meditation under "Har Ghar Dhyaan"- a joint initiative of Ministry of Cultural Affairs and Art of living.

The next activity of the day included a visit to the Botanical Garden of CCS HAU. This garden dedicated to the collection, cultivation, preservation and display of a wide range of plants labelled with their botanical names. This also contain specialist plant collections such as cacti and other succulent plants, herbs different varieties of vegetables and many other flowering plants.

Further, the volunteers were also taken to Dr. Mangal Sein Agricultural Sciences Museum of CCS HAU. The museum houses the collection of antiquities showcasing development of agriculture and rural society in Haryana. The collection includes dresses, agricultural and farm tools and implements, rural tools and equipment, rural music instruments, Haryanvi folk dresses for men and women, farm vehicles, etc

Next, the volunteers also visited Nehru Library of Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agriculture University.

Furthermore, group song and slogan writing competitions were conducted. A cleanliness drive was also conducted after the competitions. 5th day of the camp ended with the cultural performances of Odisha and Tamil Nadu.





DAY 6 (03/03/2023)

Again, the day started with a yoga session. After breakfast, there was an academic session including a lecture by Dr. SK Pahuja (Dean of College of agriculture CCSHAU). The lecture was based on art of living and various pillars of self-confidence. He also encouraged the volunteers to give their best to everything. He also threw light on five important human valuestruth, non-violence, righteousness, peace and love. The second session of the day included a guest lecture by Shri. Kashmiri Lal on "Vocal for Local" and Aatmnirbhar Bharat.
