#### 11 Scholarship, Fee Concession & Students' Aid Fund Committee Report

Objective: The main objective of the Committee is to recommend concession in fee and fee waiver to the students who belong to economically weaker sections and also to students who have met with any causality making it difficult for them to continue their studies due to financial constraints. The students fill fee concession forms, which are scrutinized by this committee to filter the deserving students. This committee also makes a decision regarding the Scholarship given to meritorious student

• Fee Concession (Freeship) : The committee has sanctioned the fee concession (freeship) to 121students ( undergraduate and post graduate) who applied for it. .The total sanction amount is rupees 22,140.00 ( rupees180 for undergraduate and rupees 216 for each postgraduate )

- Student Welfare Fund : This year the committee has approve the financial help to 129 students of undergraduation and post graduation from the Students Welfare Fund. The sanction amount is 5000 for each 129 student. The total sanction amount is rupees 645,000.00.
- Annual Fee : The committee approve the 18 students for full fee waiver. The amount for fee waiver is 12,500 for each 18 student. The total sanction amount is rupees 225,000.00

#### 6) Gandhi Study Circle Report

Gandhi Study Circle has been quite proactive and productive in meeting the goal of socioeconomic, linguistic and communal inclusiveness through its various activities and cultural programmes. Keeping in tune with its commitment to an inclusive environment and fostering tolerance and harmony among diversities, Gandhi Study Circle organized an Essay Writing Competition on 2nd Sep 2022 on "Gandhi and his Global Relevance". In the month of September, 2022, teachers and students from Gandhi Study Circle along with one nonteaching staff member from the college participated in "Sadbhavana Sammelan" organized by Harijan Sevak Sangh to commemorate the 90<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Harijan Sevak Sangh by Mahatma Gandhi in 1932. Also, they organized a visit to Gandhi Smiriti and Darshan Samiti. Gandhi Study Circle organized two separate events to commemorate Gandhi Jayanti and Martyr's Day, respectively. To celebrate these occasions a National Students' Seminar was organized under the aegis of DU Centenary celebrations in Nov 2022 where Professor Salil Misra delivered a keynote address on "Gandhi's Hind Swaraj: A Framework of Decolonization". Poster making competition was also organized in Feb 2023 on "Mahatma Gandhi's Contribution to Indian Freedom Struggle". The events received enthusiastic participation from students who captured varied aspects of India through their paper presentations and poster-making skills.

□ Gandhi Study Circle organized an "Educational trip to Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti", Tees January Marg, New Delhi comprising 51 college students and the committee members. Gandhi Smriti, formerly known as Birla House, is a museum dedicated to Mahatma Gandhi where he spent the last 144 days of his life before his assassination on 30th January, 1948 at the same location. The bus carrying the enthusiasts reached the venue at 12 noon where they were greeted and divided into two groups of 25 students each by the two tour guides. The students were first taken to the Martyr's Column, the spot where Mahatma Gandhi was shot dead. Then the students were taken to the prayer area where Gandhiji would offer his daily prayers. The area and its walls were painted with stories from Mahatma's life which appeared like a motion picture on Gandhi's life. The students were then directed to the multimedia section of the museum which was prepared and designed from the funds of Indian Government in 2005. The audio-visual technologies used to portray Gandhi's life and his teachings left an indelible mark on the psyche of the students. Later, the students were headed towards the library which showcased the books of authors Gandhiji would read and his personal belongings. The trip was very successful in many respects as the students took away many lessons home from Gandhi's life and struggles and were left in awe of this great soul who ever walked on this earth. Students were also provided refreshment on the way.
