2. Sanitary pad donation drives

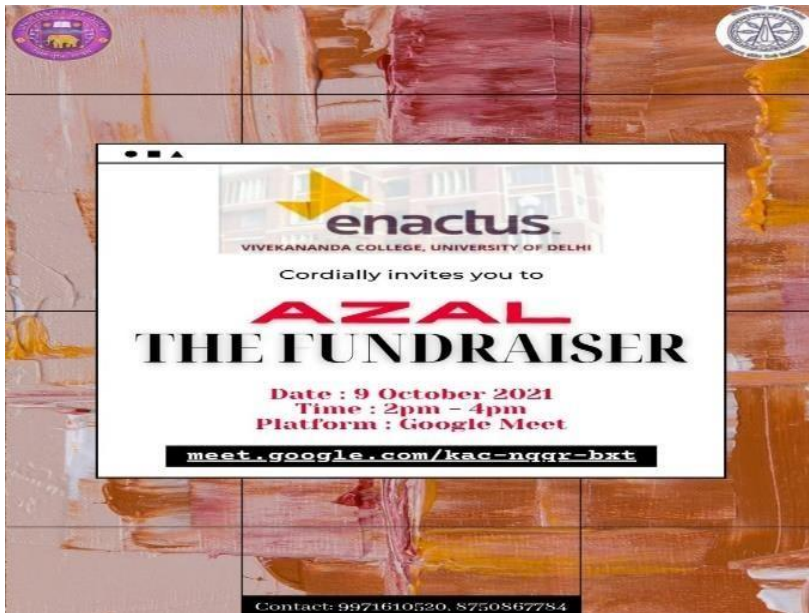
- Enactus VNC utilised the proceeds from Azal 2.0 to support sanitary pad drives

2. Online Add on course on 'Legal Education and Awareness Project' (LEAP) course by SOCDC and DLSA

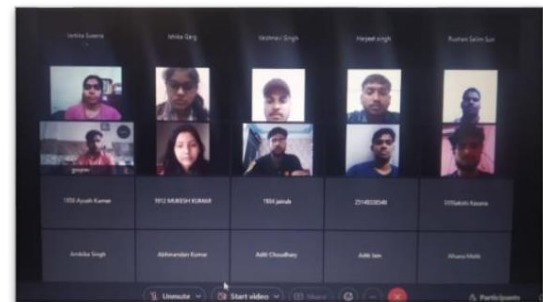
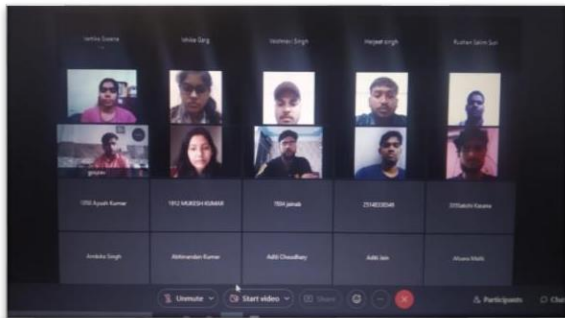

Event – Survey using Questionnaires focussing on cleanliness campaign

Date - 6 -11 October 2022

The NSS unit of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi, conducted an online survey using a questionnaire to gauge public opinions on cleanliness in their surroundings. Volunteers actively administered the survey, resulting in an impressive response of approximately 552 participants from October 6 to October 11. The collected data focused on various aspects of cleanliness, including the availability of dustbins on streets, the use of plastics in local areas despite bans, and the potential hazardous effects.

The questionnaire encompassed inquiries on pollution reduction, fostering individual responsibility towards the environment, and the prevalence of door-to-door garbage collection versus the improper disposal of waste on streets. Additionally, the survey aimed to raise awareness about the consequences of unhygienic surroundings by posing questions about diseases that can result from poor cleanliness and hygiene practices.

The initiative not only successfully gathered valuable data but also served as a platform for spreading awareness about the importance of maintaining a clean and hygienic environment to prevent the spread of diseases. Furthermore, to foster a more interactive dialogue on the findings and objectives of the survey, a vartalaap (discussion) was conducted on October 21st. This session provided an opportunity to openly discuss the survey's objectives and outcomes.

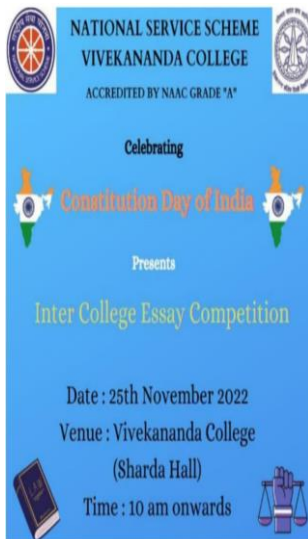
Event Name : Essay Competition on Constitution day

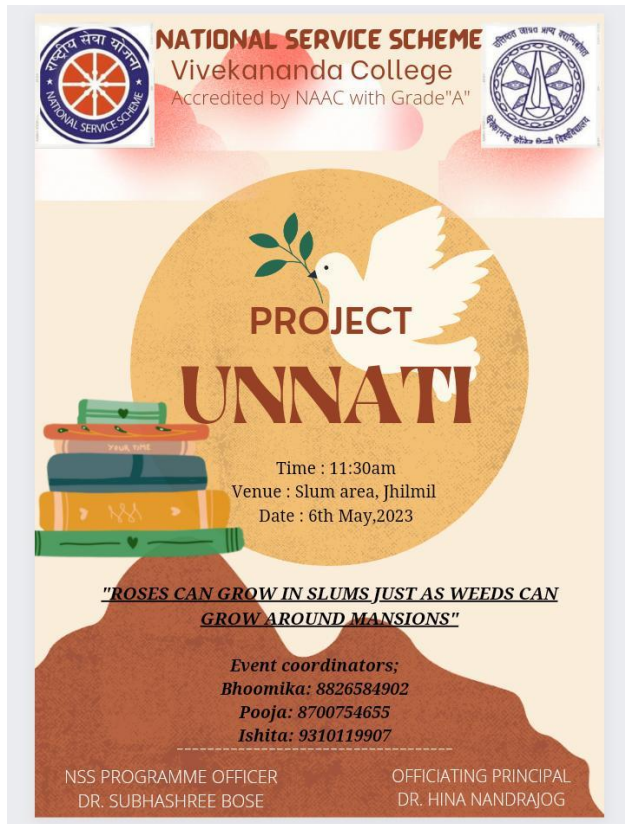

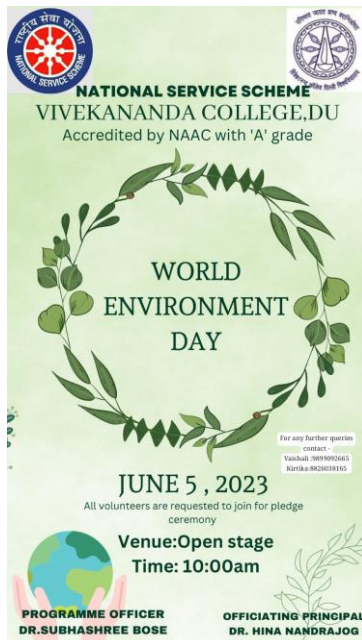
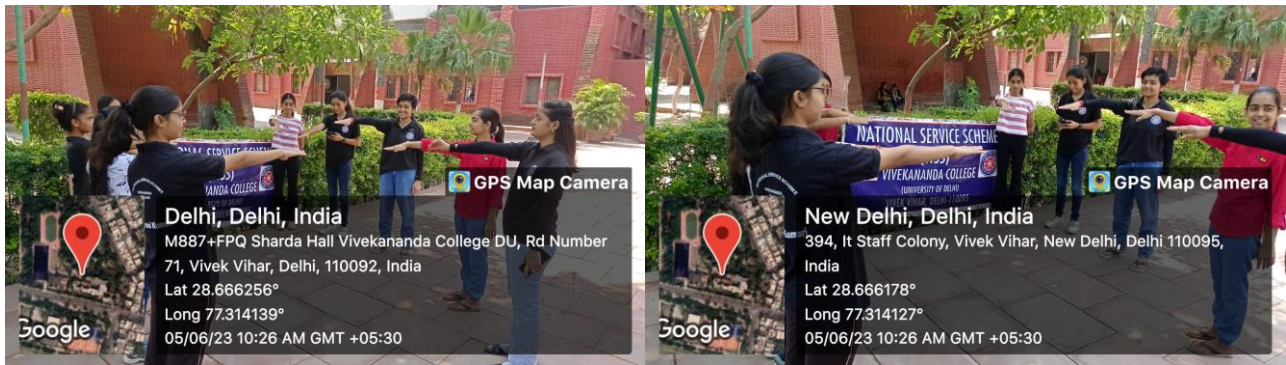

TEACHING LEARNING PROCESS

The teaching learning process will be based on lectures, class presentations, text readings, discussions, audio visual methods and practical activities. Lectures will focus on understanding key concepts, theories and debates in the field along with a detailed examination of current research findings.
