# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

# 1. THE FIRST PARTY

Quite a few students have been readily admitted in renowned universities and have good jobs. Vivekananda College is situated in Vivek Vihar, Delhi - 110095, (Hereinafter called the 'First Party' or College, which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the subject or context thereof, include its successors and assignors)

# 2. THE SECOND PARTY:

The Institute for Industrial Development (IID), an incubator under the public private partnership with Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises and Samadhan Samiti, having its office at Gandhi Darshan, KVIC Pavilion, Rajghat New Delhi. It primarily discharges its responsibilities for online and offline training of Entrepreneurship development on behalf of Ministry of MSME, as incubator in the field of Entrepreneurship development. The training is through online portal and mobile apps. (Hereinafter called the 'Second Party' or IID, which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the subject or context thereof, include its successors and assignors)

It is also a START UP Incubator promoted by Govt. of Uttar Pradesh and set up under PPP mode to educate, update, and train professionals and entrepreneurs and guide them with the latest technology, schemes, manufacturing processes, machinery details, project cost, etc:

# 3. Purpose of MOU:

Self-employment and entrepreneurship development is a key concern for both the parties and both are working for it according to their strength and domain expertise. It is obvious that Vivekananda College is more focussed on its key area of education and IID is focussed on entrepreneurship development, skill development, and on providing industrial knowledge to create industry-ready educated youth. Therefore, this MOU is designed to synergise the common areas of expertise and focus on entrepreneurship development and skill development of educated youth who are enrolled in various courses of various streams of education.

3.1. The youth shall be motivated through online workshops and EDP training, Industrial Readiness Program (IRP), short term courses and allied nurturing programmes through online portal and mobile apps. The students shall be encouraged enroll according to their domain specific stream related business

models or industries. IID is imparting training, providing guidance and updation of knowledge to aspiring students regarding setting up of industries, start-ups and small businesses through its unique

- 3.2. IID is the only virtual incubator in India with the Ministry of MSME, which is nurturing the youth and aspiring Entrepreneurs through weekly live Industrial workshop, expert episodes, industrial documentaries, project reports, registration, and Government schemes guidance. It is also managing MSME helpline through its call center. It has its own YouTube channel named "Entrepreneur India TV" and "Udyami India". It has its own production house at Rajghat, New Delhi which comprises of fully equipped Audio Video Studio with Chroma Facility, Editing Room, and Live Streaming equipment in Real Time. It has an in-house production team, which comprises of cinematographers, editors, anchors and content writers.
- 3.3. IID will appraise students of Vivekananda College about IID programmes so that the students from various streams are able to enrol voluntarily on IID portal iid.org.in and entrepreneur India Live apps for Online Entrepreneurship Development training and nurturing with various industrial process. The student may download the mobile apps to update themselves about the working of the various industries, which may give them better understanding of their job roles as well as help in self-employment. IID shall also provide this platform to alumni students of various streams to do EDP programme, who want to start their business after doing jobs or have not been able to get employment according to their qualification and skills. These Entrepreneurs can generate employment through this process and the upcoming students may be employed under these industries. IID agrees for a special concession in fees for students of Vivekananda College.

Both organizations agree to undertake the following activities:

4. First Party Roles:

The role of the First Party shall include the work designated to its departments/ committees and faculty, of the First party. The role may be defined as follows:

- 4.1. The First Party shall provide its platform to IID regarding implementation of Entrepreneurship Development Programme (EDP), Skill Development Programme, Industrial Readiness Programme (IRP) and allied nurturing programmes at/ to its various streams of education.
- 4.2. The First Party shall advise the Second Party to conduct workshops and seminars according to the requirement of the students. This will enable students to upgrade their knowledge and information about various industries, especially food industry/ e-commerce. The students enrolled with Second Party for a programme can submit their project online after attending or watching various industrial documentaries and workshops. The assessment shall also be made online and the certificate may be downloaded online. A hard copy shall be provided, if desired on request.
- 4.3. The students who wish to be self-employed or wish to start a business or industry or start-ups, may join online EDP courses for long term nurturing and guidance. These students are eligible to apply for loan under PMEGP scheme after completion of education and are exempted for mandatory EDP training for disbursement of loan by this certification of IID.
- 4.4. The expert and faculty of the Institute shall update lectures or workshop at our mobile apps with college logo and it may be utilized by the IID to show in their web site or Youtube channel to promote the content as well as the Institution incentives.

- 4.5. The link to IID courses shall be made available on college website for the period of MoU.
- 4.6. First and Second Party shall collaborate for 5-10 days Faculty Development Programme(s).
- 4.7. First Party shall appoint a Nodal Officer and team for coordination to facilitate implementation of this programme in an effective manner and generate valuable contents for the students. Programme scheduling will be done with mutual consent with team IID.
- 4.8. First Party shall collaborate and coordinate with IID to facilitate: create/ contribute/ establish pool of e-content/ technologies, expertise, technology providers, technology seekers, and other resource
- 4.9. Both college and IID will mentor, assist, and guide students and faculty in promoting and developing entrepreneurship and self-employment through continuous, professional, and planned

# 5. Second Party Roles:

The IID shall conduct these roles/ activities through their own and associate network. The IID is an incubator Ministry of MSME and shall provide virtual and physical nurturing of students through the use of technology and various online tools. No activity/ programme of IID shall interfere with the academic interests of the students. The role of IID shall be as under:

- 5.1. The Second Party shall educate, train, and guide and evaluate/assess students on various business models of entrepreneurships, development and industrial nurturing of the students through online portal and mobile apps according the domain of education.
- 5.2. The Second Party shall enroll students in Entrepreneurship Development programme (EDP) or Industrial Readiness Programme (IRP), and other related programmes irrespective of any stream of education. The project will be provided to the enrolled students on quarterly basis in each year under these programmes. IID agrees for a special concession in fees for students of Vivekananda College.
- 5.3. EDP/ IRP training shall be available in video lecture format in Hindi/ English, recorded by renowned experts of industries and professionals. Along with these lectures PPT shall also be provided in English for better/ further understanding of the subject.
  - 5.4. The EDP portal and mobile apps shall contain various industrial documentaries, experts' episodes, and project reports for various business models and related to education stream & job roles. These shall help students to develop better understanding of the subject and help to start their business or getting a job.
  - 5.5. The online workshops and seminars are also telecast on mobile apps for the students on weekly basis for various industries and business models for the knowledge upgradation of all the enrolled students.
  - 5.6. The empanelment of experts shall be made (at the discretion of IID) for various domains of expertise with the help of the First Party. These experts shall deliver their lectures and conduct live/ physical workshops from the studio of the Second Party at Rajghat New Delhi or at college campus or other relevant places equipped with live streaming facilities of live telecast (as per Gol norms). - 5.10. The Second Party shall guide the students through a call centre for students for different types of knowledge of EDP/ IRP training, projects, business registration, and job opportunities.
- 5.11. The Second Party shall provide knowledge of major Government schemes through their portal in video and PPT formats at the portal and mobile apps.
- 5.12. The Second Party has EDP content of 60 hours in video/ PPT format (Hindi & English) in the form of industrial documentaries, expert's episodes, project reports, and further other allied content on business models and industries would be developed according to requirements on regular basis.

The financial cost shall include the cost of onetime services like industrial documentaries, episodes, EDP course, IRP course, content and project report and other component of recurring operational costs to run portal, hosting, call centre etc. This will be made part of another MoU or exchange through letter or mail.
- 7. This MoU is valid for a duration of two years from the date of signing this agreement. This MoU may be extended or replaced by other agreements on similar or amended terms and conditions as agreed by the both the parties.
- 8. This agreement to arbitrate shall be specifically enforceable. A Party may apply to any court with jurisdiction for interim or conservatory relief, including without limitation a proceeding to compel arbitration.

- 9. In the event of breach of the MoU/ agreement, the College and IID shall make reasonable efforts to reach an amicable settlement thereof. If they cannot reach an amicable settlement all disputes arising in connection with this MoU thereof the same shall be referred to an Arbitrator appointed on/ with mutual consent of both the parties. The city of arbitration shall be New Delhi, India.
- 10. The College and IID are free to terminate the MoU at three month's notice as per mutual consent; however this shall not affect the training of the students already enrolled.
- 11. Both parties agree that each other's logo shall be used in all promotions, documentaries, episodes, documents concerned by other party and related to training only, but not for any other commercial purpose.
- 12. Any amendment or changes in the scope of work or terms of engagement under the MoU could be modified from time to time with mutual consent and in writing.
- 13. It is certified that parties will mutually discuss and consult each other for any provisions arising out of this agreement in order to identify and decide upon the manner in which the activities are to be done. Parties will be guided about their role and related activities from time to time by way of exchanging letter and emails.

#### MoU FOR VIDYA VISTAR SCHEME

Memorandum of Understanding under the Vidya Vistar Scheme

Vivekananda College of the University of Delhi

This Tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is entered under the Vidya Vistar Scheme (hereinafter referred to as V2Scheme), an initiative of the University of Delhi to establish academic linkages between its Colleges and Departments with the corresponding Institute in remote areas of the country.

## Among

The University of Delhi a University enacted under the Act of Parliament (Act No VIII of 1922), having its office at Vice Regal Lodge, North Campus, Delhi-110007, and represented by its REGISTRAR, of the First Party

Vivekananda College of the University of Delhi, having its registered office at Vivek Vihar, Delhi 110 095, represented by its Principal, of the Second Party

#### and

Government Model College, having its registered office at Office of The Principal,
Government Model College, Deithor, Deithor-782480, Karbi Anglong, Assam
(address of the partner institution), represented by Principal, of the Third Party.

The Second and Third parties shall be jointly referred to as 'Partner institutes' and all the three parties shall be jointly referred to as 'Parties'.

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Recognizing the India's dream to be a global superpower in the coming decades depends primarily on enhancing the skills of its human resources to meet global demands and increasing innovations and start-ups to fuel the economy. The roles that the universities, colleges and other educational institutions have to play is crucial in this context.

Realising that alone, each Party will require investment of considerable amount of its resources for the developmental activities. However, being a developing country, it would be in the best interest to maximise the utilization of existing resources available with the Universities/ academic institutions by sharing the same, through academic collaboration and cooperation amongst them, for augmenting the human resources.

Therefore, the Parties witnesseth as under, which defines the framework for the cooperation of the Partner institutes in the following sections -

- The Parties are agreeing to partner under V2Scheme for the purpose of enhancing the mutual growth and development of each other.
- The academic bonding is based on the principle of mutual respect, cooperation and sharing between the two parties as equal partners.
- 3. The Second Party shall extend its academic resources and facilities available for the V2Scheme to the Third Party with an aim to be catalyst for the faster growth of the latter. The Third Party shall share it academic resources with the Second Party to the extent possible, on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research.
- 4. The areas of cooperation between the two Partner institutes shall include the following:
- 4.1. Organize online/ offline lectures, workshops, trainings, meetings and other such programmes aimed at capacity building of the faculty members of both the Partner institutes. To the extent possible, visits of faculties will be facilitated for this purpose.

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- 4.2. The teachers and researchers of the both the Partner institutes may be engaged in Joint research activities and be co-investigators in the research programmes submitted to funding agencies.
  - 4.3. Joint research publication by teachers/ researchers of the Partner institutes shall be encouraged.
  - 4.4. Library resources may be shared for providing support in capacity building of the faculty and for improvement of their teaching and research skills.
  - 4.5. To forge mutually beneficial linkages with its partners through various platforms so as to initiate and assist innovation activities and boost start-ups.
  - 4.6. To cultivate the feeling of brotherhood among youths of the two institutes through sports and extracurricular activities.

# 5. Intellectual Property Rights:

Ownership of any intellectual property (including but not limited to confidential information, know-how, patents, copyrights, design rights, rights relating to computer software, and any other industrial or intellectual property rights) developed jointly during the course of this MOU shall be vested in Partner institutes to this MoU. The Partner institutes shall have the joint right to determine the commercial exploitation and disposition of such intellectual property, and Partner Institutes shall make joint applications for the registration of the same. Before any registration or commercialization of any intellectual property takes place, the Partner institutes agree to reach a separate agreement covering issues such as exploitation rights and revenue sharing. Any publication regarding such intellectual property shall only be possible with the prior written consent of Partner institutes, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld. University of Delhi shall be free to use perpetually the results arising out of the collaborating activities for its own internal teaching, research, educational, clinical and publication purposes without the payment of royalties or other fees to the other parties.

6. The University of Delhi shall facilitate in the process of establishing partnership

under this Scheme. It shall oversee the general implementation of the V2Scheme.

7. The Second Party shall submit a report to the University of Delhi within seven days

of completion of any activity taken up under V2Scheme.

8. The MoU will come into force from the date of putting the last signature on this

MoU.

9. The MoU shall be for a duration of 02 years.

10. The Parties may renew the MoU for a further period of the same duration with

mutual consent of the Parties. The process for renewal may be initiated three months

prior to the expiry of the term of the MoU by any of the two Partner institutes.

11. The MoU may be terminated prior to the completion of the term by any Party to the

MoU by giving one month prior written notice to the other two Parties. Once

terminated, neither parties will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise,

which the other institute may suffer.

12. However, any ongoing project, course, joint research or publication which have

been initiated by the Partner institutes prior to the date of termination shall be

continued as if no termination has taken place.

13. The MoU is intended to be an expression of general understanding and intention of

the Parties. The Parties shall make earnest effort to carry out the tasks undertaken in

this MoU. However, it shall not be an agreement enforceable in a court of law.

Nothing in this Memorandum shall be construed as creating any legal relationship

between the institutes. This Memorandum is a statement of intent to foster genuine

and mutually beneficial collaboration.

14. Any disagreement/ differences/ dispute between the Partner institutes shall be

resolved through mutual discussion between them. In case any dispute remains

unresolved, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi shall be

final and binding on both the Partner institutes.

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- 15. In case of any force majeure, such as flood, earthquake, epidemic, etc. the Partner institutes shall be excused from performing obligations which are directly impacted by any act of force majeure.
- 16. This MoU constitutes the complete agreement between the Parties with respect to the collaboration under V2Scheme. The terms of this MoU may be amended by mutual consent of the Parties in writing. Participating faculties, staff and students involved in any activities under this Memorandum must adhere to the laws of the country and Rules and Regulations of the institutions.
- 17. This MoU shall be executed in triplicate with each Party keeping an original.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the Parties hereto, through their duly authorized representatives, have signed and executed this Memorandum of Understanding on the day, month and year mentioned herein.

#### Memorandum of Understanding

#### Between

#### And

## University of Buraimi, Sultanate of Oman

#### Cooperation in the areas of study and educational services

Desiring to establish collaborative relations between the two institutions to promote friendship and to co-operate in a mutually beneficial association, the two institutions have agreed that:

- 1. The two institutions shall encourage co-operation in any discipline which is studied in both the institutions.
- 2. The two institutions shall seek to promote:
  - exchange of information and academic materials that are of mutual interest
  - · exchange between the two institutions relating to :
    - > academic faculty and administrative staff
    - > research staff
    - > visiting scholars
    - > students
    - > other staff mutually agreed upon
    - > conducting Seminars/Webinars/Conferences/Workshops/Training Programs
    - > conducting collaborative research projects
    - > any other related programs and cultural programs
  - provision of briefing/orientation services by each institution for visitors from the other institution
  - Other forms of co-operation which the two institutions may jointly arrange.

Details of any such activities will be subject to a subsequent detailed separate Agreement that will be mutually entered into and will be attached to this MoU as an annexure.

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- 3. The two institutions shall decide through consultation the specific areas and details of co-operation within the framework of this Agreement, and shall consult from time to time, at the request of either institution, for the purpose of reviewing the operation of this Agreement.
- 4. The financial arrangements involved in the implementation of this Agreement shall be settled through consultation between the two institutions in respect of each program of co-operation for which separate Agreement shall be signed after obtaining appropriate approval from relevant competent authorities of each party.
- 5. The Agreement shall become operative on the last date indicated hereunder and shall remain in force for a period of one (1) year with an option to renew for similar period.
- 6. This Agreement may be amended by mutual consent of the parties in writing and supplemented by detailed subsequent agreement between the two institutions. Amendments and or supplements will be appended as an annexure.
- 7. Either institution may terminate this Agreement by giving six (6) months prior notice in writing to the other institution. The rights and liabilities of the parties with respect to any ongoing project/training/exchanges shall remain unaffected by the termination. The same shall be completed as if no such termination has taken place. For conditions not covered by this Agreement, or for problems that arise during the course of this Agreement, both parties undertake to refrain from unilateral action and to consult and negotiate mutually acceptable decisions.
- 8. The institutions shall confer concerning the renewal of this Memorandum of Understanding six (6) months prior to the date of expiration.
