## Social Outreach and Community Development Committee (SOCDC)

### SSF VNC CAMP

The Social Outreach and Community Development Committee (SOCDC), Vivekananda College, has continued to engage itself with social outreach and extension activities. One programme has partnered with Slum Swaraj Foundation (SSF) – an NGO and is focused on conducting regular educational camps for the slum children in Jhilmil Colony. Education is the first step in the making of an advancing society. Primary education is an out-and-out prerequisite for continuous development. Primary schools make an influence on children's academic progress as well as their family background. The main objective of Slum Swaraj Foundation is to bring awareness among the children, open avenues of opportunities along with self-development and reduce inter-generational academic poverty.

In the last session, during the pandemic, the offline camp was not functional and due to this college student members were engaged in the online '**Saarthi: Ek Ache Kal Ke Liye initiative**' to support students from nearby slum areas. The Saarthi initiative aims to establish a relationship between a teacher (Student member) and a student (underprivileged) on the basis of Intellectual Guardianship. With the concept of "**Each One Teach One**",

But from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2022, an offline camp has been started for the kids of Jhilmil Colony. A day in a week is assigned to each volunteer for going to camp and teach Jhilmil kids. Besides teaching, they celebrate festivals and national days with them. Volunteers also help them with moral support, educational guidance, etc. The initiative is running successfully. 37 volunteers are part of this initiative.







### Exhibition of SDG Panels

Social Outreach & Development Community Committee in association with Bharat Soka Gakki organized an exhibition of 25 panels including 17 panels of SDG on the theme of “Seeds of hope and action” on 12<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> January 2023. These panels were put in foyer area of the college. Volunteers explained the concept of 'SDG' to the guests and had an interactive talk on the same. The exhibition had a wonderful concept and idea which says 'It starts with one'. The purpose of this exhibition was to promote a culture of sustainability and establishing respect for the dignity of all life in society by spreading awareness among the young generation. 2. On 16.05.2023. Pledge-taking on the occasion of 'LIFE': Lifestyle for Environment. This was to bring about positive behavior change among students.

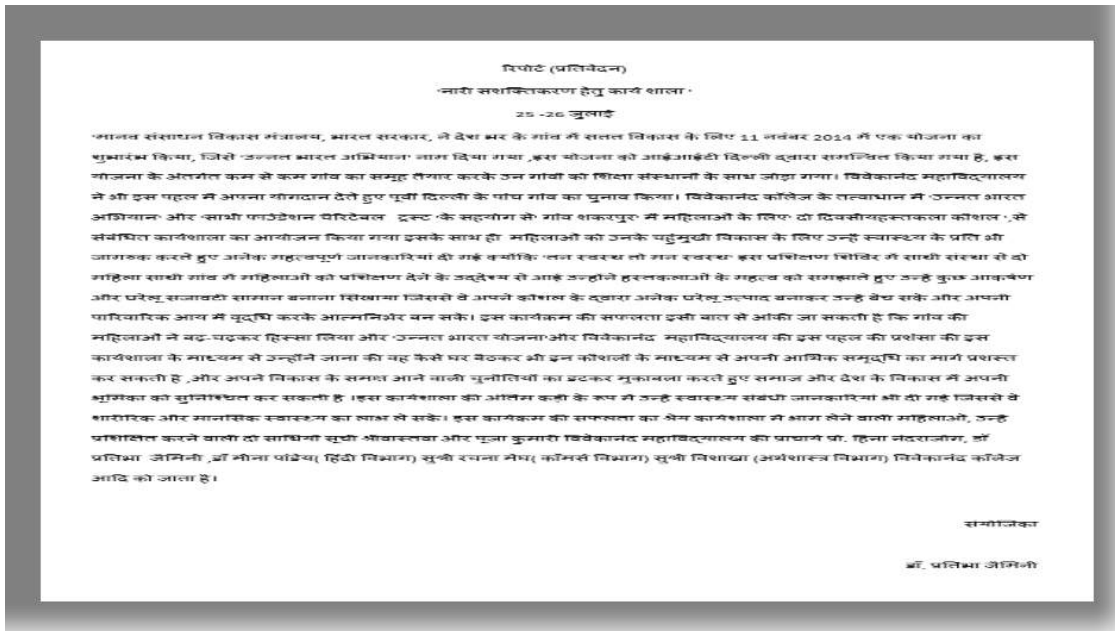

**Event 9:****Group Discussions on "Preventing Suicides and Promoting Mental Wellbeing in College Campuses" and "Creating/strengthening youth friendly health services" in collaboration with NIMHANS, Bengaluru.**

Date: 24th and 25th April 2023

Objective: To strengthen efforts to prevent suicides & promote wellbeing in college campuses.

Youth 20 (Y20) is an official consultation forum for youth from all G20 member countries to be able to dialogue with each other. Y20 aims to encourage youth as future leaders to raise awareness about global issues, share ideas, engage in dialogue and reach consensus. NIMHANS is conducting Y20 consultations on the theme 'Health, Wellbeing and Sports' as part of the G20 Presidency of India. A group discussion and Actionable Ideas as a Youth were discussed on 'Preventing Suicides and Promoting mental wellbeing in college campuses' and 'Creating/strengthening youth friendly health services'. In the discussion, the participants brainstormed various strategies, suggestions and recommendations for health systems, healthcare providers and the government on the theme of making health services youth-friendly & more easily accessible and also concluded how can the college authorities can contribute to spread awareness about suicides and help in preventing them.

- Workshops with a discussion about mental health by people with lived experiences.
- Introducing concepts of emotional intelligence from primary school.
- Making websites/apps/ portray free counseling for college campuses.
- HODs can assign teachers to the batch for daily mood check-in.
- Mentorship sessions are to be taken seriously.
- Subjects like emotional intelligence, the art of being happy should be made compulsory and should be taught by professionals instead of normal school/college teachers.
- Raising awareness about teen pregnancy, child raising sessions for parents
- More strict rules on ragging/ bullying
- Making mental health facilities grading system in campuses mandatory by NAAC
- Maintaining a sound counselor-client ratio in educational institutions and organizations.
- 'Psych camps' should be set up in urban and rural areas- just like medical camps, which provide free medical evaluations and help; professionals from the field can donate some time for pro-bono work in these camps.



- Promoting psychological first aid courses amongst the youth and further making them part of the educational curriculum.
- Creating localized helplines (numbers and centers) for suicide prevention and mental health care, to increase accessibility and availability; were shared.



**Event 10:****Mental Health Campus Drive in collaboration with Youth for Mental Health.**

Date: 12th and 13th April 2023

Objective: aimed to to raise awareness around youth suicide prevention through various activities and fun sessions.

#### **Event 11:**

#### **Workshop on 'Youth Suicide Prevention' in collaboration with Outlive.**

Date: 10th May, 2023

Objective: Building awareness about Suicide Prevention

Outlive is a joint initiative by Sangath, the Centre for Mental Health Law & Policy, and Quicksand Design Studio. Outlive aims to reduce suicide among young people aged 18-24 years, address broader conversations around mental health stigma and encourage help seeking. Activities are implemented with young people in New Delhi, Pune and Mumbai. The goal of the workshop was to build students' literacy and awareness of suicide prevention strategies. The workshop focused on initiating conversations on mental health, distress and suicide prevention. Over the two hours, the facilitator discussed myths about mental health and suicide, risk factors and warning signs, how students can cope with distress, and avenues to seek support during crisis and severe distress





**In the students' own words:**

"I learned the factors that affect mental health and the language that we could use while talking about suicide."

"I got great insights on how to initiate a conversation in an empathetic manner, when signs of suicide are observed. Also got to know about the various factors that may be responsible other than mental health issues. Would definitely apply the knowledge try to help people around and provide support to people."

The NSS unit of Vivekananda College, University of Delhi, orchestrated an impactful online survey by administering a questionnaire aimed at gauging public sentiment regarding cleanliness in their surroundings. Volunteers diligently conducted the survey, gathering a remarkable response between October 6th and October 11th, amassing a substantial dataset comprising 552 entries. The questionnaire delved into various aspects of cleanliness in the vicinity, encompassing inquiries about the presence of dustbins on streets, the persistent use of plastics despite bans, and the awareness of associated hazardous effects. Queries also addressed potential solutions, including pollution reduction strategies and fostering individual responsibility towards the environment. Additionally, it sought to ascertain the prevalence of door-to-door garbage collection versus the unfortunate sight of garbage accumulation on streets. An integral aspect of the questionnaire was its role in spreading awareness. Participants were educated on the correlation between unhygienic surroundings and severe diseases. For instance, questions addressing diseases spread due to poor cleanliness, such as Dengue, Hepatitis, or both, aimed at emphasizing the health hazards associated with neglecting cleanliness. The questionnaire served as an eye-opener, revealing the community's perspectives and behavioral tendencies. Among the insights gained, it was notable that 333 respondents admitted to feeling hesitant or reluctant when it came to picking up garbage from roads—an observation shedding light on the reluctance individuals often exhibit towards taking direct action for cleanliness. This initiative not only collected valuable data but also served as a catalyst for introspection, prompting individuals to recognize their roles and responsibilities in ensuring a cleaner environment. It stands as a testament to the power of awareness and education in fostering a collective commitment towards a cleaner and healthier community.

Beyond the immediate donation, the drive had a broader objective—raising awareness about menstrual hygiene and promoting health safety practices within the community. By engaging with the local residents, the volunteers sought to dismantle stigmas and misconceptions surrounding menstrual health while emphasizing the importance of proper menstrual hygiene management.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the camp started with a yoga session that began at 06:30 AM and ended at 08:00 AM. The yogic practices were done under the guidance of a reputed Yoga Trainer, Shri. Rohtash Arya. After the breakfast the first academic session started at 09:00 AM in which Mr. Sajjan Kumar (Sub-Inspector IGO office), gave a lecture on nation building and volunteerism. He also addressed the problems faced by youth like drugs, suicide, road accidents. Additionally, he encouraged to volunteers to stay vigilant and help the needy. Next, he interacted with the volunteers and addressed their questions. The second academic session included a guest lecture by Rajinder Saini (Former Deputy Secretary Punjab State Red Cross). He gave lecture on CPR and first-aid. He taught the volunteers how to save the life of a person in emergency through CPR (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation). He also spread awareness about the first-aid to be given to brain haemorrhage patients. After the academic session, the events of the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the camp started. There was solo singing and collage making competition and 2 participants from each team participated in these competitions. Games and recreational activities were also conducted in the evening. In the end, volunteers of the states of Punjab, Jammu and Kashmir and Delhi performed cultural dances and songs to represent their culture.





### DAY 3 (28/02/2023)

Third day at camp also started with morning yoga. After breakfast, the day started with lamp lighting and NNS anthem. The schedule of the day was based on G20 & Y20 activities. The chief guest was Dr. Surinder Singh (CCS AVC, Hisar). He delivered an academic lecture on the environment problems and solutions, climate change and global warming. The second academic lecture was given by Devender Singh Dahiya who was a 4-time NSS awardee. He conducted a motivational talk and made volunteers aware about the role of formal education in personality development. After lunch, there was speech competition in which 2 participants from each team participated. Next, an integration march was also conducted in which all the states represented their culture. Further, the volunteers from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh gave their cultural performances. The third day of the camp ended with the national anthem.





#### DAY 4 (01/03/2023)

The fourth day started with morning yoga. After breakfast, the academic session started with lamp lighting and NSS song. The academic session included a lecture by Mr.Naveen Jain

(Comptroller, CCS HAU, Hisar) on entrepreneurship .He encouraged the volunteers to not only invest in finances but also in their relations, health and family. After lunch, there was a historical visit to Agroha Dham. Agroha Dham is a Hindu temple complex in Hisar district, Haryana, India. Construction of the temple started in 1976 and was completed in 1984. The temple is dedicated to the Hindu Goddess Mahalakshmi. In the evening, volunteers from the states of Maharashtra and Rajasthan gave cultural performances. As usual, the day ended with national anthem.





### DAY 5 (02/03/2023)

Day 5<sup>th</sup> of the camp started with a morning session. After breakfast, the proceedings started with the NSS song. The academic session of the day included a lecture by Niraj Kumar Gupta (State Media Coordinator, State Council Member of Govt. programs and an industrialist by profession). The topic of the session was “Art of living”. He made the volunteers aware about various techniques to focus on the present. According to him, controlling breathing can give people the liberty to control their emotions. It was a very interactive session. After that, he also introduced the volunteers to the practice of meditation under “ Har Ghar Dhyaan”- a joint initiative of Ministry of Cultural Affairs and Art of living.

The next activity of the day included a visit to the Botanical Garden of CCS HAU. This garden is dedicated to the collection, cultivation, preservation and display of a wide range of plants labelled with their botanical names. This also contains specialist plant collections such as cacti and other succulent plants, herbs different varieties of vegetables and many other flowering plants.

Further, the volunteers were also taken to Dr. Mangal Sen Agricultural Sciences Museum of CCS HAU. The museum houses the collection of antiquities showcasing development of agriculture and rural society in Haryana. The collection includes dresses, agricultural and farm tools and implements, rural tools and equipment, rural music instruments, Haryanvi folk dresses for men and women, farm vehicles, etc

Next, the volunteers also visited Nehru Library of Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agriculture University.

Furthermore, group song and slogan writing competitions were conducted. A cleanliness drive was also conducted after the competitions. 5<sup>th</sup> day of the camp ended with the cultural performances of Odisha and Tamil Nadu.



### DAY 6 (03/03/2023)

Again, the day started with a yoga session. After breakfast, there was an academic session including a lecture by Dr. SK Pahuja (Dean of College of agriculture CCSHAU). The lecture was based on art of living and various pillars of self-confidence. He also encouraged the volunteers to give their best to everything. He also threw light on five important human values- truth, non-violence, righteousness, peace and love. The second session of the day included a guest lecture by Shri. Kashmiri Lal on “Vocal for Local” and Aatmnirbhar Bharat.

After the academic session, group dance, solo dance and rangoli making competitions were conducted. In the evening, volunteers from the states of Sikkim and Assam gave their cultural performances.



**DAY 7 (04/03/2023) – Valedictory**

The last day of the camp was for valedictory session in which Dr.Kamal Gupta, Minister of Urban Development & Housing, Government of Haryana, was invited as the chief guest. He addressed the volunteers and shared his experiences. He said that National Integration Camps are being organized in India for a long time. The objective of these camps is to build a unity and peace with spiritual harmony between different states and cultures of India. The POs and Volunteers shared their experiences and applauded the host for the hospitality and merit of the sessions and events. The valedictory session also included an integrated cultural performance by the volunteers of all the participating states. In the end, the participation certificates were distributed.
