
2. ABOUT THE SOCIAL OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (SOCD), VIVEKANANDA COLLEGE, AND PROJECT 'HUM'

Our Committee and our Project

The Social Outreach and Community Development Committee (SOCDC) (2018) of Vivekananda College was formed to carry out extension and outreach programs in neighbourhood areas with the aim for sustainable development of the society. The objective was to create awareness about social issues, develop appropriate social values as well as responsibilities in all sections of society.

With the belief that education can break barriers and be a great equalizer for any society; the Social Outreach and Community Development Committee of Vivekananda College has launched 'Project HUM – Bridge the Gap'. As the name suggests, through this project we hope to collaborate with the community members (more specifically community members of Jhilmil Colony) to reduce the gaps between the mainstream and the marginalized sections of our society primarily in the area of education as well as undertake civic initiatives. Later we also hope to address other important issues as well such as health, environment, women empowerment etc. We hope that this can eventually help the underprivileged to break the cycle of poverty and thereby create a more inclusive society.

A logo making competition for creating the logo of 'Project HUM – Bridge the Gap' was held on 6/9/18 where students participated enthusiastically. Kanishka Bhardwaj was the winner.



Our Goals

We hoped that through our various initiatives, this committee would eventually help the underprivileged to break the cycle of poverty and thereby create a more inclusive society. We hoped to do this by empowering disadvantaged students, women, poor people and other marginalized sections of the society, thereby giving them more control over their lives.

Bridging gaps and transforming society.

Our Mission

Driving positive social change by creating environments for lifelong learning

Our Action Plan

This would be fluid depending on the needs of the community and linkages with NGOs. The local community will be facilitated by college volunteers, NGOs, and governmental agencies, all working in collaboration with each other in order to empower them and give them more control over their lives. They can thus take responsibility for their lives and share their knowledge of life to plan and to act.

Principles that guided us

- 1. Community Participation: Since we believe that the local community would be partners in the entire process, therefore the entire process would involve the local community members to gather information, analyse the information and come up with their own solutions.
- a) Learn from the community. We believe that we can learn from the community and will be guided by the norms of the community and acknowledging the relevance of the traditional knowledge as well as conventions of the local community. We believe that we will need to be 'committed participants' rather than behave like detached observers. Thus rather than only 'teach' the community we will be a learner in the process and would be guided by the belief that the community would best be able to solve their own problems through a collaborative process.
- b) Role of the college volunteers: We will be only acting as 'facilitators' and not as 'teachers'. This process will involve changing our attitudes from 'from dominating to facilitating, empowering and enabling them to conduct their own analysis'. We will try to follow local norms as far as possible. As facilitators we will carefully pay attention to their every activity and listen to local people (rather than lecturing). We will decide on appropriate visiting times according to the convenience of the local community, respecting their knowledge, skills and expertise. We would have an attitude of learning and embracing error.
- c) Inter-learning and inter-sharing experiences with each other. Although we will respect traditional and local knowledge but this does not mean that the community will always be right and that their attitudes should be left unchanged. Similarly the so called 'expert knowledge' introduced by outsiders may also always not provide an appropriate solution to the problems. Thus, collaboration between the college students and local community members is important as it will provide a platform to share experiences of both parties. The two systems will complement each other, leading to greater awareness in the local community about their resources and their ability to be self-reliant.
- d) Involvement of all the community groups. All sections of the local community would be involved in the entire process; men and women, rich and poor, young and old, teachers and students, RWA members and local community etc.
- e) Self-reflexivity about oneself: Our attitude will be one of being self-aware, accepting our mistakes and learning from them, and continuously trying to do better.
- 2. Flexibility The entire exercise would be conducted in a flexible atmosphere, which

- would be free from any pressures, characterized by openness, and a sense of being informal. Such an atmosphere will promote closer relationships with the community, so that the volunteers are accepted as part of the community.
- 3. Teamwork— The entire exercise would be a team effort involving college volunteers, local community, governmental agencies, NGOs etc.

Phases of our action plan

Planning Phase

- 1. Identifying the youth community in college dedicated to the cause
 - Identifying the youth community in college who are dedicated to the cause: holding meetings with the college students,
 - Identifying student coordinators from different disciplines for organizing and managing the activities. Each department will have two to three student coordinators.
 - Identifying team coordinators
- 2. Identifying the target group: Elderly, women, children, Underprivileged sections of society. We eventually targeted the slums of Jhilmil colony due to the proximity to our college.
- 3. Target need analysis: It is important to get some background information on the area to be covered. Such information can help in describing broad features and trends of the area concerned. Sources of such data can be both primary and secondary. Primary information would involve:
 - Meeting the community leaders as well as community members from the identified area
 - Meeting the Government representatives
 - Feedback from college volunteers belonging to that area
 - Meeting NGOs working in that area
 - Identifying areas for interventions

Some secondary sources would include surveys, books, reports, plans, official records, census records, project reports etc.

- 4. Developing youth (college volunteers) teams: Develop different teams of college volunteers for the various activities. Some of the teams are as follows:
 - Media and promotion
 - Fund generation and finances
 - Research related activities (on field survey, data collection)
 - Data analysis
 - Executive team
- 5. Training the college volunteers for required skills

- Training the college volunteers in various skills: Communication skills, research related skills, marketing skills, counselling skills
- Collaborating with an NGO for orienting students to go to the field and collect data.
- Training students for interventions to bring about a change.
- 6. Data analysis and designing interventions
 - All the data that has been gathered from need analysis (Step 3) and from the field surveys conducted by the students shall be analysed.
 - The areas that require attention will be prioritized and intervention programs for the same shall be developed with the help of concerned NGOs and experts working in that area.
- 7. Deciding the interventions
 - The students along with teachers shall deliver the interventions in the field. This shall also be made more effective with collaborations with appropriate NGOs.

During fieldwork

- 1. Rapport formation and developing a trusting relationship: It is important that the college volunteers develop a trusting relationship with the local community so that they feel comfortable and can trust the volunteers. This would involve
 - Talking in the local language,
 - Knowing and respecting local customs,
 - Knowing the local leaders,
 - Having a genuine interest in local issues and
 - Choosing a time and venue that is convenient for the local community.
- 2 Maintaining protocols: This is an extremely important step. One needs to have a list of Do's and Don'ts or a set of rules which all college volunteers need to follow. Some of the protocols are as follows:
 - Each member pursues a sub-project, following one's own line of questioning and reasoning;
 - Members will move around in small groups of 3 or 4
 - No members should visit homes under any circumstances
 - The clothing should be appropriate to the context preferably ethnic wear
 - No members should remain in the field after 5.30 pm in summers and 5pm in winters.
 - The relationship should be close but professional
 - Unwanted persons (e.g. drunks, trouble makers etc.) are politely diverted by a team member (a pre-chosen gate keeper); and
 - After each day's sessions, the members debrief as a group, discuss findings and observations.

3. OUR JOURNEY: TENTATIVE BEGINNINGS

The Staff Council had acknowledged the need for engaging our students in community and extension activities and with this intent the 'Social Outreach Committee' was formed in 2018. A meeting of the newly formed committee meeting was held on 27/8/18 and we decided to rename the committee 'Social Outreach and Community Development' instead of simply 'Social Outreach' as our mission is to promote sustainable community development in the neighbourhood areas through various outreach services/programmes initiated by the committee. The philosophy of this committee was captured in Project 'HUM' which emphasized sustainable development of the community by engaging communities in a manner that will be productive, foster positive relationships and will furnish the support needed by the community. Later on, we renamed this project 'Project HUM – Bridge the Gap' to emphasize that the objective of the project was to reduce the gaps between the mainstream and the marginalized sections of our society primarily in the area of education as well as undertake civic initiatives. A logo making competition for creating the logo of 'Project HUM - Bridge the Gap' was held on 6/9/18 where students participated enthusiastically. Kanishka Bhardwaj, student of B.Com (Hons), was the winner. The members decided that the committee would be involved in collaborative work with the community in three ways: linking community, people and organizations (such as NGOs and govt. organizations) by bringing them in contact with each other; developing awareness programmes based on need assessment of the community; and providing training to develop skills and competencies.

Our Initial Research: Knowing our neighbourhood (October 2018)

Targeting the area of Jhilmil Colony

As a crucial first step it was considered important to evaluate our sociocultural environment where we were planning to operate. It was decided to carry out a small scale project pilot project in the nearby Jhilmil colony to facilitate understanding of the community. This pilot project initially entailed the following: to assess the health related needs of the community of the targeted residents of Jhilmil colony; to develop awareness programmes with the aim to improve the health of the targeted residents; to provide appropriate linkages with health related NGOs, organizations, Hospitals, Doctors etc. and to providing appropriate training to develop health related skills and competencies. After a lot of brainstorming, it was decided that our main focus would be on HEALTH and four groups would be targeted in the nearby Jhilmil colony: Elderly, Children, Women and disabled

Collection of Information

We already had a dedicated group of teachers who were given various tasks related to collection of information. Mr. Abhishek Bhaskar was assigned the responsibility of collecting the demographic profiles of the residents of Jhilmil colony through various sources (such as govt.). We also decided to collect information about the various NGOs, Govt. organizations, and relevant legislations with respect to the specific group of the targeted population. The following members were assigned the responsibility of collecting information about the specific group: Disabled: Ms Laxmi; Women: Dr. Gargi Sengupta; Elderly: Dr. Shafaq Zareen; Slum Children: Ms Anchala Paliwal. To generate

funds from various sources: Dr. S. Verma and Dr. S. Sharad. Meetings with DM and other officials that can provide the committee with support in their endeavour

Developing a team of dedicated students (2018)

We needed a dedicated group of students for this project. We started with creating awareness amongst the college students about the committee and encouraging students dedicated to the cause to be members of it. It was decided that notices and posters would be put up on the college premises as soon as possible. All members of the committee would be involved in this task.




• Daan Utsav' was celebrated from 09/10/2018 to 13/10/2018. Students, teaching and non-teaching members donated stationery items for the underprivileged.

2. Developing linkages with schools in and around Jhilmil

We initially hoped that we could provide educational assistance in the form of special classes/tuitions to school students. So, with this goal in mind we visited a number of schools in and around the vicinity of Jhilmil colony. In this regard, we had discussions with several principals including Mrs Sandhya Sharma, the principal of Govt. Girls Senior Secondary School, Jhilmil Colony. Mrs Sandhya Sharma, principal of Govt. Girls Senior Secondary School informed us that about 30 students of her school were interested in getting some kind of tuition after school from our volunteers. The rooms were also available after 2pm in this school since it was a morning shift school. However, this would require permissions from the District Magistrate (DM). We immediately wrote to the DM.



We wrote to Hon'ble Shri K.Mahesh, District Magistrate (East Delhi), Delhi for requesting collaboration with his esteemed office in the fulfilment of our vision of 'Bridging gaps and transforming society' through our social outreach and community development programme – 'Project Hum'. We wrote in the hope of securing us safe and secure spaces/rooms/community centers/school buildings, where we could conduct our classes with the local student community. We also wrote to him for financial support. Though we did not get any financial support but all other support was promised to us immediately.




Poster for Electoral awareness walk as part of Electoral Literacy Program

4. Developing linkages with NGOs

We started contacting some NGOs to know about their work and get our members involved in some extension activities. For e.g. a we collaborated with an NGO (Grameen Sneh Foundation) to organize a Cyclothon on 10/3/19 ("Cyclothon 2019- Fight Against Cancer" in New Delhi on 10th February 2019 (6:00 AM -9.30 AM). Student volunteers were Mansi Kashyap, Rakhi Verma, Suman Gupta, Jyoti, Akansha, Samiksha Rastogi, and Tanu Juneja. The cyclothon started from Yamuna Sports Complex to India Gate in New Delhi. The objective of Cyclothon 2019 was to spread cancer awareness during the world breast cancer month with the central idea of eliminating this disease through early detection and awareness campaigns. In this programme, several cyclist enthusiasts, cancer survivors, several eminent doctors, sports persons, civil society representatives etc. participated. Flag Hoisting ceremony took place at Yamuna Sports Complex (near Vivekanand College) and several community members cycled from Yamuna Sports complex (Near Vivekanand College) to India Gate (total 11 K.M.).




Poster for Cyclothon-2

Meetings with Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLSA)- Mid 2019

During the period of 2018 end till middle of 2019, we had tried to do some substantial work as per our goals of reaching out to the community. Although we did work a lot in other areas, we could not carry out the kind of work we wanted to do in Jhimil colony via community work. We realized that it is rather difficult to reach out to the community unless and until we work with some organizations that have enough experience to work at the grassroots levels. Hence, our Principal was able to organize a very beneficial meeting with Ms Shipla Dalmia from Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLSA) on 10/7/19. Delhi State Legal Services Authority has been constituted by an Act of Parliament to provide free and competent legal service to the weaker sections of the society and to organize Lok Adalats to ensure that the operation of the legal system promotes justice on a basis of equal opportunity. We had very long discussions and following were some of the suggestions:

Target area

Areas adjoining our college: DSLSA is active in Jhilmil colony, Farsh Bazaar, and Flyover community and so we could target these areas.

Activities

- 1) Open a socio-legal literacy club with membership restricted to about 30-40 students at present) so that we can associate with DSLSA. Following would be some of the activities by the club:
 - Reaching out to the community: Through the club and its association with DSLSA, students will be involved in community programs. This would essentially remove the obstacles that we have been facing in the last year such as organizing, funds, security issues, space for conducting classes etc.
 - Seminars/workshops: Legal experts would be invited to make students aware about their duties, fundamental rights, laws, rules and regulations. Group discussion on the topics like gender sensitizations, rehabilitation of acid attack survivors, welfare of senior citizens, environmental issues etc.
 - Internship programs: The club through its association with DSLSA could have internship programs where students could be placed with them. maximize benefits of free legal aid services. These internship programs would involve students in the conduction of legal literacy camps in Jails, awareness programmes in slum & labour colonies, promotion of Alternate Dispute Redressal Mechanisms
- 2) Voluntary work at Swabhiman (centre run by DSLSA near our college): Students would be involved in various activities especially those centered on teaching the EWS.

For motivating students, Ms Dalmia has suggested that DSLSA can give certificates, based on attendance in these activities after a period of 6 months.



Meetings with NGO-Slum Swaraj Foundation (SSF)- Mid 2019

We then invited another NGO Slum Swaraj Foundation. This is a registered NGO that focuses on education of underprivileged children who reside in these slums. This NGO is being run by college-going students, who contact the children living in the slums after school hours. SSF operates in several cities including Delhi, Noida, Ghaziabad, Gorakhpur, Lucknow, Saharanpur, and Greater Noida. We met several of their coordinators including Mr. Mohammad Sanif, Mr. Adheesh Tripathi, and Mr Aman Lalwani- all students of a local Engineering college and passionate about their work.



4. SUMMARY OF OUR PRESENT WORK: AUGUST 2019 TO FEBRUARY 2021

The Social Outreach Committee has two main groups of students working in two different areas. One is associated with Delhi Legal State Authority (DLSA) and the other with an NGO called Slum Swaraj Foundation (SSF). A summary of the list of activities of both groups is given, followed by a detailed report of the two groups.

Team 1: Association with NGO (Slum Swaraj Foundation)

VNC team with NGO-Slum Swaraj Foundation

This team is responsible for primarily conducting regular educational camps for the slum children in Jhilmil Colony. The camp commenced on 20th of August 2019 with 100+ registered members of college and 50+ slum children. The classes ran continuously (except Saturday, Sunday and College Exam Break) from August 21st 2019 to March 2020. Subsequently they were held online due to the Corona pandemic and the lockdown.

Details of the Educational Camps

- Location of Camp: Jhilmil Colony
- Dates and timings of Camp: Started on 20th of August till March 2020 (closed during Saturday, Sundays, Preparatory leave and holidays) One hour everyday (except Saturday and Sunday) between 3.30 to 4.30 pm.
- Objective of the Camp: The main objective of Team VNC and Slum Swaraj Foundation is to bring awareness among the children, open avenues of opportunities along with self-development, and reduce inter-generational academic poverty.
- Membership of College Students enrolled for taking the classes at the camp: Total: 107 College Students
 - 1. 20 College students on Monday

I. About our work with SSF

This team is primarily responsible for conducting regular educational camps for the slum children in Jhilmil Colony. The camp commenced on 20th of August 2019 with 100+ registered members of college and 50+ slum children. The classes were running continuously (except Saturday, Sunday and college exam breaks) from August 2019 to March 2020.

From March 2020 onwards the initiative has become online. During the ongoing pandemic, college student members are engaged in the online 'Saarthi: Ek Ache Kal Ke Liye' initiative to support students from nearby slum areas. The Saarthi initiative aims to establish a relationship between a teacher (Student member) and a student (underprivileged) on the basis of Intellectual Guardianship. With the concept of 'Each One Teach One', it organizes a platform for the under-resourced children to interact with a teacher/mentor during the lockdown period and continue their studies without any break. Due to technological limitations in the slums, the mentors take about 3-4 online sessions with a child in a week. Online mentoring includes teaching, moral support, educational guidance, social etc. via mobile. The initiative is running successfully and will continue till the reopening of the camp.

III. Activities at the Educational Camp (Besides teaching)

A list of all activities given below:

- 1. Orientation Programme and Slum visit 07th Aug, 2019: Primarily a workshop was conducted to make the students aware of how exactly things work in Slum Swaraj Foundation. Shortly afterwards a survey and awareness drive was initiated by a team of students at Jhilmil colony, wherein the students interacted with the parents of children to make them aware of the proceedings of the camp while also stressing on the importance of quality education. A list of interested students and parents was compiled.
- 2. First session of Camp Begins: 20th Aug, 2019

- 1. Teacher's Day Celebrations: 5th Sept, 2019: Not forgetting about the children was our children's day celebrations wherein samosas and chocolates were distributed. The children enjoyed themselves thoroughly and showcased their talents by reciting poems, dancing, and singing.
- 2. Meeting (members): 24th Sept, 2019
- 3. Meeting (PTM) 24th Sept, 2019: As the camp grew more stable, a parent teacher meeting was organized wherein the parents were informed about the importance of primary education, health, and well-being; and they were also encouraged to make children join the camp.
- 4. Test Conducted: 17th Oct, 2019
- 5. Diwali Mela Stall at VNC (SSF Stall) on 22nd Oct, 2019: As a part of the donation drive some members put up a stall at the VNC Diwali Mela "Rishti". The entire amount collected as a result of this stall was donated for running the educational camps.
- 6. Diwali Celebration 24th Oct, 2019: It was the first festival for the children and the members together. The children thoroughly enjoyed dancing to melodious beats and later showcased their creativity in decorating diyas and making rangolis. Next a diwali puja took place and the story of Lord Rama and Ravana/ the Ramayana was narrated. The children had a dancing and singing competition too wherein the children enjoyed a lot. After this the rangoli and diya decorating competition was held.
- 7. Children Day Celebration on 14th Nov, 2019: Children's day celebrations were held and samosa and chocolates were distributed. The child enjoyed thoroughly and showcased their talents by reciting poems, dancing, and singing
- 8. Gurpurab Celebrations on 12th November, 2019: Stationery and books were distributed among the children (Stationery Distribution event)
- 9. Cloth Donation on 15th Nov, 2019: A clothes donation drive took place in order to collect clothes and donate among the homeless and the less privileged. First, boxes were placed in the VNC college campus so that faculty and students could donate clothes. Posters too were circulated online as well as offline in order to spread the message, and the response was very good. A lot of clothes, bed sheets, shoes, bags etc were collected. The collection was placed in three locations near the Dilshad Garden metro station. The response was overwhelming.
- 10. Prize Distribution on 15th Nov, 2019: On the last day of the camp, the prize distribution ceremony for the competitions held during the Diwali celebrations were held. The winners were announced and they were provided with medals as a token of appreciation. Finally on 15 November 2019, this session of the camp came to a successful end as the college exams were to commence from December.
- 11. Second session begins: 6 January 2020 For this session some new students were enrolled. New post holders and stationery and books were distributed among the children and the members were divided according to days into groups. Each group was given two managing heads to improve the functioning of the camp. A new group of mentors were selected for this session. The members worked diligently with the children in order to prepare them for the world ahead. The members maintained a daily log and homework register in order to bring about continuity in what the children are taught. The members also took up tasks of posting regular updates on social media platforms. After the initial functioning of the camp was ensured, the two mentors of each day also visited the slum in order to spread awareness about essentialities of primary education and bring more children under the umbrella of the NGO, Slum Swaraj Foundation.

- 12. Republic Day celebrations in the camp: 27 January 2020 was chosen to celebrate the Republic day. Children were informed of the true meaning of a republic nation and how their rights towards a healthy and educated life are ensured by the Indian Constitution.
- 13. Paper presentation by SSF member in the International Conference on Perspectives on Peace and Sustainable Development in a World of Conflict, held from 13th-15th February in Vivekananda College, University of Delhi. Mr. Adheesh Tripathi presented a research paper with the title 'Slum Swaraj Foundation: An Initiative to the Attainment of Sustainable Development Goals in Education, Gender Inequality and Health'. He also got the opportunity to interact with the Chief Guest for the conference, Nobel Peace Laureate, Kailash Satyarthi. Our efforts were discussed with him and Mr. Satyarthi appreciated the work being done by the NGO and the college students with a praising note. Another Guest Speaker at the conference, Mr. Brian Aycock, a US war veteran who then went on to work with humanitarian organizations, interacted with some of the members and also visited the camp. He conversed with the children and was highly impressed by the work done by the team at the ground level.
- 14. Session meeting and Holi celebrations: 3 March 2020, wherein camp's ongoing workings were looked upon and discussed in detail. Holi, the festival of colours was celebrated with the children and sweets were distributed. The children were told the tales behind the festival and emphasis was laid on how one must play a safe Holi.
 - Some of the children on the camp appeared for their board exams. Proper study material and guidance was provided to them.
- 15. Closing the Camp: 15/3/2020: Finally the camp was closed for a period of time due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus. Children were also informed of its symptoms and guided about the precautions to be taken to remain safe and healthy.





स्लम स्वराज फाउंडेशन के सदस्य के अनुसार युवा नेतृत्व में शुरू हुआ ये संगठन आज 1500 युवाओं का परिवार बन चुका है। यह प्रतिदिन बच्चों को पार्क में शिक्षा देते हैं और उन्हें नैतिक मूल्यों का पाठ पढ़ाते हैं।

III DSLSA: Report of Activities (Detailed)

a. Knowing our Area: Jhilmil Slums

An introductory session with Ms Shipla Dalmia introduced the students to the activities of DSLSA. A walk around the slum at Jhilmil Colony was organized in order to survey the people about their prevalent legal issues on August 30, 2019 at Jhilmil Colony, Rajiv Camp, Shahdara, Delhi from 4 pm onwards. The event started with Adv. Shilpa Dalmia instructing the volunteers about the DOs and DON'Ts while taking the survey. The students were instructed very carefully because they were going out and taking a survey for the first time. It was followed by volunteers giving a presentation on government

schemes, the task they had been assigned in the previous Introductory Session. The volunteers were divided into three groups named NYAYA, SAMTA and BANDHUTA. Bandhuta group gave a presentation on "child related schemes", Samta group on "women related schemes" and Nyaya group on "senior-citizens related programmes and schemes". The volunteers researched the topics thoroughly and made an excellent presentation. After the presentation; the volunteers were taken to the targeted area, Rajiv Camp, Jhilmil Colony by Adv. Shilpa Dalmia after ensuring that the volunteers were aware of what they have to do. Attendance of the volunteers was taken for safety purposes. After reaching the area, the volunteers, in pairs of two, started to conduct the survey. Each pair was provided with questionnaires and DSLSA's pamphlets. The volunteers asked people if they had any legal issues and to fill the questionnaire if there were any. The volunteers walked around the slum for one hour asking people about their issues. Initially, people were a little hesitant to talk but after 10-15 minutes, when the news spread that some volunteers had come to help, people began to open up and speak about their issues to the volunteers. After one hour, Adv. Shilpa Dalmia gathered all the volunteers and asked them about the experience. The session came to a close with the volunteers clicking photos with the constable and Paralegal Volunteers who were present during the campaign in order to ensure the safety of the group. Overall it was a good exposure for students and they were very excited for the next session.

b. Health Camp-cum-legal Awareness Programme- Jhilmil Slums

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Health Camp -cum- Legal Awareness Programme was organized on September 13, 2019 from 1:30 pm onwards at Jhilmil Colony, Krishna Mohalla Park, Opp. Verma Jewellers, Shahdara, Delhi. Around 7-8 physicians were present at the camp with a counsellor as well. Health check up for eyes, blood sugar level and blood pressure was provided free of cost to the local people. Eye drops were given to the people whose eyes were found to have some infection. Prescription was given to people who were found to have abnormal blood sugar level and blood pressure. Adv. Shilpa Dalmia and Adv. Sakshi Arora were present for legal consultancy under the Legal Awareness Programme. Meanwhile, all the girl-student volunteers present went door-to-door to persuade people to get their health checked up and get legal consultancy if they had any health or legal related issue. People came in great numbers and overall, it was a successful event.

c. Rally On 'beat The Plastic' – Jhilmil Slums

A Rally on BEAT THE PLASTIC was organized on September 20, 2019 from 3 pm onwards at Jhilmil Colony, Krishna Mohalla Park, Opp. Verma Jewellers, Shahdara, Delhi. The walk started from Apna Park, Opp. Verma Jewellers with volunteers holding posters and banners and calling out slogans and catchphrases highlighting the demerits of usage of plastic in order to persuade people to limit the use of it. The volunteers were accompanied by Adv. Sakshi Arora and two teacher coordinators of Vivekananda College, Dr. Sunil Verma and Dr. Shivantika Sharad. The volunteers talked with people of that locality and also took small interviews of shopkeepers, household ladies, and children asking them if they are still using polythene bags. It was found that most of the shopkeepers have stopped giving plastic polythene bags and instead, are using paper bags or cloth bags. However, the attitude of household ladies was very negative, they pointed out the difficulties that they were facing due to the ban on plastic bags. The volunteers tried to persuade them by highlighting the demerits of plastic and the harm it is causing to our environment. The volunteers talked with children to try to encourage their parents to

limit the use of plastic. It was a successful event and it is hoped that this initiative created awareness among the people of that locality and would bring about a change in their attitudes.

d. Aadhar card installation

On 27th September, a programme was organised for installation of Aadhar card on the basis of the data that had been collected from door-to-door campaigns. The team which installed the Aadhar card was arranged by DLSA. The students of our college along with Adv. Sakshi Arora supported the team.

e. Door-to-door campaign

Pairs of volunteers collected the data in the second survey. Each pair was provided with questionnaires and DLSA's pamphlets. The volunteers asked people if they had any legal issues and filled the questionnaire. The volunteers walked around the slum for one hour asking people about their issues.

f. Awareness campaign about Corona

A campaign was done in the Rajiv camp of Jhilmil colony area regarding awareness of corona virus. Students walked around the area, talked to the people living there, told them about the spread of the virus and the safety measures that they can take to keep themselves safe. They also pasted some posters on the boards.

g. Menstrual Hygiene and Cervical Cancer Awareness on 4/5/2020

During the COVID-19 times it was difficult to actually go out to the community and work with them. Thus, a Webinar was organized on the above topic. Dr. Neelam Lekhi, Sr. Consultant Radiologist, National Chairperson, IMA — Mission Pink Health and Delhi State Chairperson, IMA (Women Doctors' Wing spoke on Menstrual Hygiene. 



b. Distribution of ration collaboration with Sewa Delhi Union

Access to food supplies is an integral necessity for human survival. In this background SOCDC under the project HUM, in collaboration with Sewa Delhi Union distributed dry ration to many families of Jhilmil Colony during the second wave of pandemic (May 2021 to June 2021). With the support of Ms. Ankita Upreti, (Vice President of Sewa Bharat and General Secretary of Sewa Delhi Union), and her team as well as student volunteers of SOCDC, the objective was completed successfully. All of the proceedings were done under the guidance of the Dr. Hina Nandrajog (Officiating Principal, Vivekananda College). Student volunteers prepared the list which included the details of

the underprivileged families. Accordingly, dry ration (rice, lentils, flour etc.) was provided to them. The donation drive was conducted in 3 phases. The first phase reached 16 families, the second phase reached 13 families and the last phase included 25 families.

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
